

- WHEREAS, Loren Jones was a pioneer in HIV advocacy, a prisoners' rights activist, an organizer and voice for those who are housing insecure, and a pillar of the Bay Area HIV community; and
- WHEREAS, Loren Jones spent most of her life advocating on behalf of women and Black people with HIV at a time when Black women were contracting HIV at higher rates than white women but were systematically excluded from HIV research; and
- WHEREAS, Jones' indefatigable activism enabled more HIV women to participate in clinical trials and receive women-specific research; and
- WHEREAS, Jones worked passionately and tirelessly on behalf of people with living with HIV in prisons and jails and brought their voices to the outside HIV/AIDS movement; and
- WHEREAS, Jones' esteemed public service includes cofounding the Positive Women's Network (PWN-USA), advocacy for Women Organized to Respond to Life-threatening Diseases (WORLD), serving as chair of the Berkeley Independent Task Force on Homelessness, lifelong involvement in the church community and serving on boards of many nonprofits; and

WHEREAS, Berkeleyans have been inspired by her courage, compassion, and commitment to the community.
