In an Emergency

These sources may have emergency instructions and information like evacuation and shelter locations:

Radio

- 1610 AM (Emergency information only)
- KPFB – 89.3 FM
- KQED – 88.5 FM
- KCBS – 740 AM
- KSOL – 98.9 FM (Spanish)

Television

All stations will broadcast messages sent by Alameda County through the Emergency Alert System (EAS). Local news networks may also carry specific information and instructions from authorities.

Get ready now to receive information in an emergency

Alameda County Alert (AC Alert) System

In the event of an immediate threat to life, health, or safety, government officials may use AC Alert to send information and instructions to affected community members.

AC Alert can send:

- Voice alerts to phones
- SMS text messages
- Emails
- TTY/TDD messages

Listed AT&T “land lines” are automatically included in AC Alert. Community members must sign up to receive voice or text alerts on cell phones, TTY/TDD phones, VoIP phones, unlisted phones or through email.

In an emergency, officials may use many different tools to communicate information and instructions to the community.

Sign up and prepare to use these systems now, before an emergency occurs!

National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) Weather Radio

NOAA Weather Radio (NWR) broadcasts emergency weather alerts and other hazard information. During an emergency, National Weather Service forecasters send a special tone to activate weather radios. NWR cannot be heard on a simple AM/FM radio receiver.

WarnME

WarnME is UC Berkeley’s alert and warning service for UC Berkeley students, staff, and faculty. WarnME is NOT the same as the AC Alert system. In order to receive WarnME alerts, you must have a “@berkeley.edu” email address.
