Item Description: Direct City Manager to Provide Monthly Reports on Berkeley

Police Department Overtime Expenditures

Submitted by: Councilmember Harrison

Recommendation:

Direct the City Manager to report to Council:

 On Berkeley Police Department overtime expenditures in FY 2020, by August 1, 2020. Reports shall include overtime totals by rank and title (including non-sworn staff, parking control officers and dispatch), and detailed narrative justifications for each expenditure. Report overtime expenditures monthly thereafter.

Rationale:

Despite recent impressive gains in filling police positions, police overtime has not significantly decreased. For the past two fiscal years, the police department has overspent its overtime budget of \$2.3 million by an average of \$3.7 million dollars.

Given the COVID-19 pandemic budget crisis and ongoing City-wide initiative to modify approaches to public safety, it is the public interest to better understand patterns of overtime spending on a quarterly basis. These reports will inform Council's budget process.
