## Major Changes to HUD Funding Plan

- Adding new COVID-19 funding to the plan
- Adding new activities
- Amending existing Citizen Participation Plan to include 5-day comment period and virtual meetings
- > Applying available waivers to lift caps on CDBG and HOME funding for public services, CHDOS and administration



#### CARES Act **Funding**

TOTAL: \$8,259,408

#### **CDBG-CV**

\$1,610,805

- Populations at or below 80% of AMI
- Public services that support mitigating C-19 spread
- Housing activities related to C-19

#### CDBG FY21 \$535,998

 Reallocating FY21 CDBG funds previously set aside for public facility improvements

#### **ESG-CV**

\$6,648,603

- Services for homeless or at-risk of homelessness
- Shelter, outreach, rapid re-housing subsidies, homeless prevention



## Funding Priorities Framework

- ✓ CARES Act focus on addressing COVID-19
- **✓ Plan links to COB homeless strategies** 
  - ✓ Respite and Rapid ReHousing supported by 1000 Person Plan
  - ✓ Create additional Permanent Housing hotel purchase
- ✓ Plan looks at COB COVID-19 response gaps for vulnerable populations
  - ✓ Mitigate COVID-19 spread by supporting existing shelters
  - ✓ Focused Equity Testing prioritizes homeless and other vulnerable populations



#### Berkeley Respite Program

\$2.1 million

- Safe housing for homeless individuals
  - 65 years and older, or
  - medically fragile and high-risk
- Participants are identified by outreach teams in Berkeley
- Three locations:
  - ■701 Harrison Street -- 10 RVs
  - ■1281 University Avenue -- 8 RVs
  - ■1654 5<sup>th</sup> Street 4-bedroom house
- Contract with BFHP
- Services include 3 meals/day, wellness checks, nursing services, mental health supports, linkage to health care
- 18-month program



### Medium-Term Rental Subsidies \$2.6 million

- 100-Day Challenge -- house 400 clients from Project RoomKey Hotels countywide
- \$2.1 million for Rapid Re-housing for 44 Berkeley clients in the North County Safer Ground Hotels
- Abode to provide services
- All households in the Berkeley Respite Program
- Also use PLHA funds



#### Increased Shelter Costs Due to COVID-19

\$897,360

#### Berkeley shelters now open 24 hours per day

- Additional costs for:
  - Meals
  - Additional cleaning
  - Purchasing Personal Protective Equipment
  - Staffing, including hazard pay

Average 20% cost increases over pre-COVID-19



### Convert STAIR to Non-Congregate Shelter

\$412,640

- Modify the STAIR navigation center physical layout
- Eliminate congregate sleeping dorms
- Install up to 30 pallet shelters
- Purchase community room and office trailers to enable improvements to mitigate COVID-19 spread
- Improvements to better accommodate individuals with mobility impairments



# Focused Equity Testing Strategy \$1.25 million

- Amplify and standardize current mobile testing program
- Testing and follow up support:
  - seniors
  - People of color with highest COVID prevalence
  - unhoused
  - shelter workers
- We estimate the need for 12,000 tests with up to 10,000 individuals at highest risk of severe complications from COVID-19 infection



# Hotel Purchase / Rehabilitation \$574,642

- Project HomeKey State of CA Funding
- Alameda County partnership with COB to purchase and renovate a Project Roomkey hotel in Berkeley
- Use as future permanent supportive housing for unhoused
- CDBG-CV and CDBG FY21 funds for acquisition and/or rehabilitation
- This is an estimate actual funded needed may be different

# Administration \$1 million (12%)

- \$500,000 each year for 2 years
- Senior Management Analyst
  - Fiscal tracking, monitoring and reporting for CARES Act funds
- CSSIII
  - existing position currently funded through the Shelter Plus Care (S+C)
  - Duties shifted to COVID-19 response, no longer eligible for S+C funding
  - S+C savings will be used for housing subsidies
- Community Services Specialist II
  - Work with community partners in our COVID response
  - Support Admin and Fiscal requirements

#### Recommendation

- 1. Accept CARES Act Funding
- 2. Allocate HOME Funds as follows:
- Up to 10% for Community Housing Development Organizations
- Up to 25% for Administration
- Remainder to the Housing Trust Fund
- 3. Allow City Manager to execute agreements and amendments
- 4. Submit the Revised Consolidated and Annual Action Plans to HUD
- 5. Adopt the Revised Citizen Participation Plan
