What is the HWCAC?

The Human Welfare and Community Action Commission (HWCAC) acts as an advisory board to the Berkeley City Council in allocating funds for programs that serve low-income people, and in developing City policies that affect low-income residents.

Why serve on the HWCAC?


Commissioners who are Representatives of low-income residents ensure the concerns of residents from low- income areas are represented on the commission. Commissioners elected from low income districts serve up to a four-year terms on the HWCAC, and there is a \$100 stipend per meeting for qualifying low- income residents for participating on the Commission. The Commission meets at least ten times a year.

Who qualifies as a Representative for low-income residents?

Anyone who lives in one of the low-income districts in South and West Berkeley (see map) is eligible to serve on the HWCAC as an elected Representative. Representatives must live in the district they represent but do not have to be low-income. Candidates for election must gather signatures on a nomination form from residents in the candidate's District.

Area 1: West Berkeley

Area 1 extends from the north edge of the Berkeley border to the south end of the Berkeley border. It extends from the west edge of the Berkeley border to San Pablo Avenue. An additional portion of Area 1 extends from Cedar Street down to University Avenue, and from San Pablo Avenue to Sacramento Street.

Area 2: Central Berkeley

Area 2 extends from University Avenue south to Ashby Street. It extends from San Pablo Avenue east to MLK.

Area 3: South Berkeley

Area 3 extends from Ashby Street to the south end of the Berkeley border. It extends from San Pablo Avenue east to Deakin Street. An additional portion of Area 3 extends from Dwight Way down to the south Berkeley border, and from MLK east to Fulton Street.
