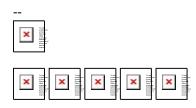
I am writing primarily to say that I fully support this upzoning and hope that it can happen as fast as possible and hereby request that urgency be given the project of codifying the proposal for upzoning approved by the City Council for this site.

I would ask the Commission and Planning Staff to allow this upzoning to happen as fast as possible and without insisting on additions of provisions and development standards that will be addressed and can be addressed in the entitlements process. In particular, I do not believe that any lot coverage restrictions should be imposed whatsoever on this land. The city already has FAR, height limits and open space requirements that impose themselves on a project in MU-LI that all developers have to deal with any and all massing and open space issues are easily dealt with using these existing instruments.

I would also say that I support a fair and reasonable staff process that may take longer than the developers timeline and that no staff or commissioner should be bullied or pressured by any developer by any thinly veiled threats around walking away if their timeline is not met. As I mentioned to the group last night. Once the zoning is upgraded and R and D allowed this land will have a TON of development pressure and attract a ton of interest.
