

## IN HONOR OF MAIA SMALL

- WHEREAS, mass vaccinations are the best solution to bringing an end to the COVID-19 pandemic that has left an unprecedented mark on the world; and
- **WHEREAS,** on February 5<sup>th</sup>, 2021, the City of Berkeley partnered with Curative to open a mass vaccination site at Golden Gate Fields, providing 20,000 vaccinations during the first month in operation; and
