- WHEREAS, AAPI Youth Rising is a student-led organization working to stop anti-Asian hate, ensure that AAPI history and ethnic studies are taught in K-12 schools, and support AAPI civic engagement; and
- WHEREAS, AAPI Youth Rising was created by middle schoolers at Black Pine Circle School in response to a troubling increase in anti-Asian hate crimes and rhetoric during the COVID-19 pandemic, including a mass shooting in Atlanta where six Asian-American women were killed; and
- WHEREAS, on March 28, 2021, AAPI Youth Rising organizers led a powerful rally of 1,200 people in West Berkeley, providing a space for the community to speak out against hate and share their experiences with racial discrimination; and
- WHEREAS, after their rally galvanized thousands of Berkeley residents to stand in solidarity with Asian Americans, the students have built on this momentum to push for change in our education system; and
- WHEREAS, the passionate and tenacious students of Black Pine Circle are an inspiration to us all and exemplify the values of the City of Berkeley.
