



Client Racial Background




Client Ethnic Background



Client Gender




Client Age Distribution







Number of shelter referrals provided to residents:







Outcome #2: Dangerous encampments are not inevitable

- 1,151 tents and structures were provided notices for the following reasons:






HRT Actions by District
