Berkeley's voter-approved Public Financing Program allows certified candidates for Mayor, City Council, School Board, Rent Stabilization Board, and City Auditor seats to receive a 6-to-1 match on qualifying contributions of up to \$60 from Berkeley residents (e.g. for a \$60 qualifying contribution, a participating candidate receives \$360 in public matching funds), to a maximum of \$49,000 for City Council candidates, \$147,000 for mayoral candidates, \$10,000 for Rent Stabilization Board candidates, and \$25,000 for School Board and City Auditor candidates
