
TOBACCO LITTER PUBLIC OPINION POLL HIGHLIGHTS

170 Responses

- 94% of respondents felt that tobacco waste is harmful to the environment
- 96% of respondents felt that tobacco waste presents a health risk to children and/or animals
- 66% of respondents felt that tobacco waste (cigarette butts, filters, packaging) is a problem in Berkeley

 71% of respondents support fines associated with tobacco waste littering





FLAVORED TOBACCO HIGHLIGHTS


Completed:

Graph 1:2013-2019; % of schools that have an unhealthy store front ad near them




In 2013, only 34% of schools had an unhealthy store front ad near them

By 2019, over 77% of schools had an unhealthy store front ad near them




Graph II: 2013-2019; Flavored tobacco products (other than cigarettes) found near schools

Graph III: 2013-2019; Sugary drinks at check-out




In 2013, 60% of retailers sold sugary drinks at check-out

ANNUAL COALITION SATISFACTION SURVEY RESULT

In an effort to improve the ongoing collaboration with coalition members, the City of Berkeley Tobacco Prevention program conducts an annual coalition satisfaction survey.

- 75% of coalition members felt membership includes a wide range of professional backgrounds and skills
- 75% of coalition members felt the coalition conducts a good job with member orientation
- 75% of coalition members felt the coalition reflects the diversity in our community



CITY OF BERKELEY HEALTH, HOUSING AND COMMUNITY SERVICES STATE TOBACCO PREVENTION PROGRAM

POSSIBLE FUTURE ACTION

- Increase community education and awareness of the harms of improperly disposed of tobacco,

- Increase no smoking ordinance enforcement where smoking is prohibited,
- Reduce the percentage of schools who have unhealthy ads near campuses,
- Reestablish coalition goals to continue addressing tobacco control topics.
