




### In Honor of Marthe Cohn


- Whereas, Marthe Cohn is a well respected nurse, author and Holocaust survivor who risked her life to gather intelligence for the French Army; and
- Whereas, Cohn served in the Intelligence Service of the French 1<sup>st</sup> Army, commanded by Marshal of France Jean de Lattre de Tassigny. Her military experience later became the basis of her book *Behind Enemy Lines: the True Story of a French Jewish Spy in Nazi Germany*; and
- Whereas, Cohn made 14 relentless attempts to enter Germany in order to relay vital information that the northwest of Freiburg and the Siegfried Line had been evacuated and the location of the remnant of the German Army laid in an ambush in the Black Forest; and
- Whereas, In 1999, the French government awarded Cohn the Médaille Militaire, Decree Number 3465 MR 1999. In 2006, she was again honored by the French government with the Medaille of the Reconnaissance de la Nation.


Now Therefore Be It Resolved, the Berkeley City Council hereby recognizes and proclaims






