 and February 26, 2015

### INTRODUCTION

On January 29, 2015 and February 26, 2015 Councilmember Capitelli attended the Alameda County Transportation Commission meetings as the assigned delegate from the City of Berkeley.

### BACKGROUND

The Alameda County Transportation Commission (ACTC) is charged with allocating proceeds from the county's ½ cent local sales tax for transportation as well as new approved funding from the passage of Measure BB. Since 2000, the ACTC has distributed more than \$828 million in Measure B direct local program distributions to local cities and transit agencies, and more than \$24 million in Vehicle Registration Fee dollars since 2012.

### REPORT

#### **January 29 Commission Meeting**

Commissioners Scott Hagarty and Rebecca Kaplan were reelected Chair and Vice Chair respectively. The consent calendar was approved with a minor change in the Commission schedule for September, 2015.

We reviewed the election results for Measure BB on the November, 2014 ballot. Berkeley voters were the strongest supporters of the measure across the entire county.

There will be in excess of \$8 billion available through the next 30 years. Those expenditures will be overseen by the Alameda County Transportation Commission.

We then adjourned into closed session to discuss a potential eminent domain action returning to open session to pass a Resolution of Necessity Authorizing Filing of Eminent Domain Action to Acquire Real Property Interests.

The meeting was adjourned with the next meeting scheduled for February 26, 2015.

### **February 26 Commission Meeting**

The most notable report at the February meeting was a presentation on the Top 10 most congested traffic corridors in the Bay Area. Winning isn't always a good thing. Alameda County has 6 of the 10 most congested corridors...and to make matters worse...none of the corridors have improved although Interstate 80 dropped from #1 to #4.
