Subject: Contract No. 10258 Amendment: Redwood Engineering Construction for Ohlone Dog Park Renovation

RECOMMENDATION

Adopt a Resolution authorizing the City Manager to amend Contract No. 10258 with Redwood Engineering Construction for the Ohlone Dog Park Renovation project, increasing the amount by \$61,000 for an amended total amount not to exceed \$389,800.

FISCAL IMPACTS OF RECOMMENDATION

Funding for this contract amendment is available in the FY 2017 budget in the Parks Tax Fund (Fund 450). No other funding is required, and no other projects will be delayed due to this expenditure.

CURRENT SITUATION AND ITS EFFECTS

The contract with Redwood Engineering Construction for the improvement project at Ohlone Dog Park, was executed in April 2016 for a total amount not to exceed \$328,800. During construction, unforeseen existing conditions required that additional work be performed. The City is presently negotiating change orders with Redwood Engineering Construction, for which an increase in the NTE authorization is needed. Additionally, the City's parks maintenance staff has identified deferred maintenance repairs or replacements needed in parks facilities. This work was not included in the contract scope, but is necessary to maintain accessibility and safe conditions at the City's parks.

BACKGROUND

This project includes renovation of the Ohlone Dog Park. There are site drainage problems and accessibility issues that need to be corrected, and improvements to the site. The work to be done includes, but is not limited to, the renovation of the existing dog park, installation of new site paving, ADA accessibility improvements, landscaping and irrigation, and other site amenities. These park improvements are part of the City's ongoing program to repair, renovate, and improve safety and accessibility at non-compliant or aging Parks facilities.

The project was advertised for bids on Tuesday, November 17, 2015, and bids were opened on December 8, 2015. The City received 7 bids, from a low of \$274,000 to a high of \$358,000. Redwood Engineering Construction was the lowest responsive and responsible bidder. References for Redwood Engineering Construction were provided and checked out satisfactorily.

ENVIRONMENTAL SUSTAINABILITY

This project improves the site drainage and includes design elements to include Bay-Friendly Landscaping, consistent with local, state and federal regulatory and environmental requirements. The construction contract includes requirements to comply with the City's Environmentally Preferable Purchasing Policy. The project is a renovation of a developed urban site and therefore will not negatively affect natural habitat.

RATIONALE FOR RECOMMENDATION

The City and Redwood Engineering Construction are negotiating a price within the City's budget for renovations and safety improvements. This increase to the contract is necessary to perform additional deferred maintenance repairs, safety enhancements, and to complete current change orders. The City does not have the in-house labor or equipment resources to complete these construction activities.

CONTRACT NO. 10258 AMENDMENT: REDWOOD ENGINEERING
CONSTRUCTION FOR OHLONE DOG PARK RENOVATIONS

WHEREAS, on February 23, 2016, the City Council authorized Contract No. 10258 with Redwood Engineering Construction in an amount not to exceed \$328,800 for the Ohlone Dog Park renovation (Resolution No. 67,381-N.S.); and

WHEREAS, an increase of \$61,000 to the not-to-exceed contract amount is necessary to make deferred maintenance repairs and complete final change orders; and

WHEREAS, the City has neither the labor nor the equipment necessary to undertake this construction work; and

WHEREAS, funds are available in the FY 2017 budget in the Parks Tax Fund (Fund 450), and the contract amendment has been entered in the City's contract database as CMS No. FHBAI.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Berkeley that the City Manager is authorized to execute an amendment to Contract No. 10258 with Redwood Engineering Construction for the Ohlone Dog Park Renovation project, increasing the contract amount by \$61,000, for a total amended amount not to exceed \$389,800.
