SUBJECT: Alameda County Family Justice Center: Relinquishment of Council Office Budget Fund to General Fund and Grant of Such Funds

RECOMMENDATION:

Adopt a Resolution approving the expenditure of an amount not to exceed \$175 per councilmember, including \$175 from Councilmember Maio, to the Alameda County Family Justice Center, on the occasion of their 10th Annual 'One' Gala, to be held on Saturday, January 28, 2017, (more information is available at acfjc.org), with funds relinquished to the city's general fund for this purpose from the discretionary council office budget of Councilmember Maio and any other councilmembers who would like to contribute.

BACKGROUND:

On Sunday, January 28, 2017, the Alameda County Family Justice Center will hold its 10th Annual 'One' Gala (more information is available at acfjc.org). The Alameda County Family Justice Center is a one-stop center, with 30 onsite and over 50 offsite agencies and programs, for individuals and families experiencing domestic violence, stalking, sexual assault and exploitation, child abuse, child abduction, elder and dependent adult abuse, and human trafficking.

AUTHORIZE THE EXPENDITURE OF SURPLUS FUNDS FROM THE OFFICE EXPENSE ACCOUNTS OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCILMEMBERS FOR A GRANT TO PROVIDE PUBLIC SERVICES FOR A MUNICIPAL PUBLIC PURPOSE

WHEREAS, Councilmember Maio has surplus funds in her office expenditure account; and

WHEREAS, a California non-profit tax-exempt corporation – Alameda County Family Justice Center – will receive funds in the amount of \$175; and

WHEREAS, the provision of such services would fulfill the following municipal public purpose: The Alameda County Family Justice Center (ACFJC) is a one-stop center, with 30 onsite and over 50 offsite agencies and programs, for individuals and families experiencing domestic violence, stalking, sexual assault and exploitation, child abuse, child abduction, elder and dependent adult abuse, and human trafficking. The proceeds from this event will subsidize ACFJC programs.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Berkeley that funds relinquished by the Mayor and councilmembers from their council office budget of up to \$175 per office shall be granted to the Alameda County Family Justice Center, through its 10th Annual 'One' Gala to support the ACFJC and its programs.
