RECOMMENDATION

Conduct a public hearing and upon conclusion, adopt a Resolution:

1. Increasing current fees for Echo Lake Youth Camp by 6.5%.
2. Rescinding Resolution No. 67,497-N.S. and all amendatory resolutions.

FISCAL IMPACTS OF RECOMMENDATION

A 6.5% fee increase will increase Echo Lake Youth Camp fees from \$493/week to \$525/week for Residents and from \$542/week to \$577/week for non-residents. This will allow the City to recover a greater share of Camp operating costs, while keeping fees lower than comparable camps in the area. Revenues collected from the fee increase will be deposited into Camps Fund Revenue Account 330-5996-347.33-01.

CURRENT SITUATION AND ITS EFFECTS

Echo Lake Youth Camp is a week-long (Monday-Friday) overnight residential camp program for ages 7-14. The program includes round-trip charter bus transportation to and from Berkeley, meals, lodging, and supervised traditional camp activities such as swimming, canoeing, archery, campfires, dances, talent shows, and arts & crafts.

The most recent Youth Camp fee increase occurred in 2008. Since then, the rate of inflation has increased 12.3% according to Consumer Price Index (CPI) data, and some costs associated with running the Echo Lake Youth Camp program have increased, including labor, transportation, utilities, and food. The proposed 6.5% fee increase would provide a small amount of additional revenue to help offset those costs, and the proposed fees will continue to be more affordable than most regional overnight camp programs (see Attachment 1).

BACKGROUND

On May 24, 2016, Council adopted the most recent Fee Schedule for Recreation Division programs (Resolution No. 67,497-N.S.), which only involved increased fees for the Gabe's Sports Fields at Harrison Park.

On November 28, 2016 at a regular meeting, the Children Youth and Recreation Commission took action to approve the proposed Echo Lake Youth Camp fee increase for FY2017, and to look into additional ways to increase low income youth/family participation such as adding a scholarship donation option box to the registration form for 2017 as well as developing a sliding fee scale for future use. (M/S: Shireman/Rogers); Ayes: Batista, Echols, Gallegos-Diaz, Rogers, Shireman, Sinai; No's: None; Abstain: None.

RATIONALE FOR RECOMMENDATION

Echo Lake Camp, along with Cazadero Camp, Berkeley Tuolumne Camp, and Berkeley Day Camp, are funded through a single enterprise fund (the Camps Fund), and together are expected to be self-sustaining. Since the loss of the Berkeley Tuolumne Camp, whose revenues were used to offset losses in other Camps, subsidize scholarship programs, fund maintenance projects, and cover management and administrative costs related to camps, there is a need for the City's other camps to cover these costs. Current projections show that the Camps Fund reserve balance will be depleted by the end of FY2019 without additional revenue or reduced expenditures, (see Table 1).

Fee increases are one of several changes to camps programs that will allow the City's Camps Fund to stay solvent over the next few fiscal years. These strategies are summarized below, followed by projected revenue or savings through FY2019:

- Replace Fish Camp with private group rental (\$20,000)
- Expand private group rentals for 2 weeks in September (\$30,000)
- Increase the number of campers/session at Youth Camp from 100 to 110 (\$47,250)
- Increase Youth Camp fees by 6.5% in FY17 (\$63,000)
- Reduce Day Camp bus expenditures (\$39,000)

As described in Table 2 below, these changes will help keep the Camps Fund solvent for one additional year, through FY 2019.

The increase in Echo Lake Youth Camp fees will add a small amount of additional revenue to offset rising operation costs, while continuing to be more affordable for Berkeley families than most regional alternatives. This fee increase will provide increased revenue to the Camps Fund, which is expected to be self-supporting and supports Berkeley Echo Lake Camp, Berkeley Tuolumne Camp, Berkeley Cazadero Camp, and Berkeley Day Camp.

ENVIRONMENTAL SUSTAINABILITY

The proposed fee increases will support sustainability in Camps Fund programs and facilities, which provide direct and indirect environmental benefits. Berkeley Echo Lake Camp is a partnership with the United States Forest Service and provides unique opportunities for environmental exposure, education, and action. The Camp embodies the principles of “reduce, reuse, recycle”, and emphasizes the importance of environmental stewardship through programs such as the Echo Lake Pioneers, encouraging youth to learn about their natural environment and take action to clean up trash and conserve water.
