Subject: Revenue Grant Agreement: Funding Support from the YMCA to Conduct Public Health Promotion, Protection, and Prevention Services

RECOMMENDATION

Adopt a Resolution authorizing the City Manager to submit a grant application to YMCA of the Central Bay Area, to accept the grant, execute any resultant revenue agreements and/or amendments, and implement the project and appropriation of funding for related expenses to conduct public health promotion, protection, and prevention services for the following revenue agreement:

YMCA of the Central Bay Area, in the projected amount of \$10,000 for Fiscal Year 2018.

FISCAL IMPACTS OF RECOMMENDATION

The City of Berkeley will receive funds in the estimated amount of \$10,000 from the YMCA of the Central Bay Area for FY 2018. YMCA of the Central Bay Area: CMS No. FE1BR, Revenue Budget Code 131-4516-331.10-80. Expenditure Budget code 131-4516-440.various. This contract is expected to be for \$10,000 in FY 2018. There are no matching funds required by the funder. Spending of these grant funds is subject to Council approval of the budget and the Annual Appropriations Ordinances.

CURRENT SITUATION AND ITS EFFECTS

As a local health jurisdiction, the City of Berkeley provides a broad range of public health program services to the community, with the goals of addressing health inequities, promoting healthy environments and behaviors, protecting residents from disease, and preventing illness, disability, and premature death. This grant will fund the following services:

1. YMCA of the Central Bay Area funds will provide pregnant women who are enrolled in the YMCA Head Start program with prenatal nursing education, linkages and referrals.

BACKGROUND

The City of Berkeley receives funding from many sources annually to complete work related to improving the health of the community. As a local health jurisdiction, the City is committed to exploring opportunities for funding to support key initiatives to augment base funding resources. The Division is committed to providing essential services to the community to prevent the spread of disease and to promote healthy environments.

ENVIRONMENTAL SUSTAINABILITY

While this program does not have specific environmental impacts, its implementation will be consistent with the Public Health Division's practices of: reducing paper usage as much as possible in daily operations, purchasing local and organic food when available, minimizing the use of single packaged food items, and usage of low-emission vehicles for transportation to workshops and presentations.

RATIONALE FOR RECOMMENDATION

These funds support vital services related to the City's mandates as a public health jurisdiction and local initiatives designed to address health inequities in Berkeley and improve the health of Berkeley residents. This competitive grant supports the Department's mission and provides the City with funding to continue working to protect and improve the health of the community.

ALTERNATIVE ACTIONS CONSIDERED

The Public Health Division assesses each funding source to ensure that it supports the City's mission and goals. The alternative action of not seeking this funding source would result in not providing these public health services to the community.

GRANT AGREEMENT: YMCA OF THE CENTRAL BAY AREA FOR PRENATAL
NURSING EDUCATION AND REFERRALS

WHEREAS, the City of Berkeley Department of Health, Housing & Community Services provides a broad range of needed public health program services to the community; and

WHEREAS, the City of Berkeley Department of Health, Housing & Community Services works to promote healthy environments and behaviors, protect residents from disease, and prevent illness, disability, and premature death; and

WHEREAS, the City of Berkeley Department of Health, Housing & Community Services seeks to eliminate health and educational inequities; and

WHEREAS, the projected amount of the grant is \$10,000; and

WHEREAS, the City of Berkeley should seek outside funding wherever possible to fund vital health services.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Berkeley that the City Manager is hereby authorized to submit a grant application to YMCA of the Central Bay Area for funding for fiscal year 2018: to provide pregnant women who are enrolled in the YMCA Head Start program with prenatal nursing education and referrals; to accept the grant; execute any resultant revenue agreements and amendments in line with the grant award, which may be larger or smaller than the projected award; and implement the projects and appropriation of funding for related expenses, subject to securing the grant.
