- Ages 2-5 Playground
 - Replace all equipment (we looked at retaining some here, not feasible)
 - Goals were
 - 1. Include sand / water play area
 - 2. Have passive and active play areas
 - 3. Have a broad range of activity types
 - a. climbing/sliding/spinning/swinging.
 - b. interactive between users,
 - c. learning,
 - d. music,
 - e. interactive with sand / water,
 - 4. Different levels of challenges within this area
- Ages 5-12 Playground
 - Replace most equipment 4 person rocker and spinner in good condition / reused.
 - Have a broad range of activity types and challenges, such as:
 - 1. Various levels and types of climbing / balancing
 - 2. Sliding / swinging
 - 3. Interactive between users
 - 4. Exploring and discovering spaces
- Tennis Courts
 - Adding courts infeasible due to cost, space and grading constraints
 - Proposed surface Plexipave slipsheet overlay system + acrylic play surface.
 - Colors TBD
 - New black mesh fencing
 - New net posts and nets
 - New bleachers
