





Law: Proposed Ordinance BMC 11.62

Applicability:



Grocery Stores Supermarket, convenience food store, foodmart, or other entity engaged in the retail sale of food items, and > 2,500 square feet floor area



Regulation:

Plastic pre-checkout bags (e.g. produce)

\$0.10 min

\$0.10 min + signage



Non-compostable "compostable" pre-checkout bags

2025 and beyond




Law: Public Resources Code Sections 42281 et seq., Senate Bill 270, Proposition 67, Senate Bill 1046

Applicability:



Full-line, self-service retail/grocery stores with annual sales of at least \$2 million that sell some perishable items **Regulation**:









Plastic bags provided to customers after meal to carry home leftovers include \$ 0.10 charge.

Retail Stores (not regulated by State)



State Definitions of Retail Store



Full-line, self-service retail stores with annual sales of at least \$2 million that sell some perishable items



Large retail stores with a pharmacy that have at least 10,000 square feet of retail space and that generate sales or use tax



Convenience stores, food marts, or liquor stores that are engaged in the retail sale of a limited line of goods, generally including milk, bread, soda, and snack foods, and that hold a Type 20 or Type 21 alcohol license





All retail stores not regulated by the state.
