Subject: Amendments to the Berkeley Election Reform Act Related to Public

Financing and General Amendments to the FCPC Regulations

Pursuant to the action taken by the FCPC on April 18, 2019, the City Clerk is presenting the attached amendments to the Berkeley Election Reform Act to improve the public financing program.

In addition, three amendments to the FCPC Regulations are attached for the Commission's approval.

The BERA amendments are incorporated into the attached draft commission report to the City Council. The FCPC may adopt amendments and the text of the report in one motion.

1. Add Regulation for 2.12.555 to define "substantial violation"

Regulation R2.12.555

A violation is deemed to be substantial if the seriousness of the offense is severe and public harm is significant. Severity and significance will be determined by assessing the following factors:

- 1. the dollar amount of the unreported or misreported violations;
- 2. the presence or lack of intent to deceive the voting public;
- 3. whether the violation appears deliberate, negligent, or inadvertent;
- 4. whether the Respondent demonstrated good faith in consulting with Commission staff during any investigation or made good faith efforts to correct any deficiencies, violations, or errors;
- 5. whether the violation was isolated or was part of a pattern of violations of this chapter by the candidate, either within the same election cycle or in past election cycles;
- 6. the effect of the violation upon the election or upon the administration of the Fair Elections Act.

2. Amend Filing Requirement for Late Contribution Reports

R2.12.295 Late Contributions

- (a) A late contribution means any contribution as defined in BMC Section 2.12.145 and received before the election at which the candidate or measure for which the contribution is intended is to be voted on.
- (b) For the purposes of this section, if the deadline to file the late contribution report falls on a Saturday, Sunday or holiday, except for the final Saturday and Sunday before Election Day, a report received by the City Clerk no later than the next business day shall be deemed timely filed.

3. Amend Redesignation of Campaign Funds

R2.12.250 Redesignation of Campaign Funds for Future Elections

(a) Defeated Candidates, Individuals Leaving Office

A defeated candidate or individual leaving office and planning to redesignate campaign funds for a future election shall do so before such funds become surplus. Funds will become surplus at the end of the post-election reporting period following the defeat of a candidate for elective office, or upon an individual leaving office, upon the 90th day after leaving an elective office, or the 90th day following the end of the postelection reporting period following the defeat of a candidate for elective office, whichever occurs last. (Govt. Code Section 89519[a])

(b) Redesignation to the Same Elective Office

The treasurer shall certify that to his or her knowledge there remains no further outstanding indebtedness in connection with the campaign. A defeated candidate or individual leaving office shall redesignate campaign funds for a future election to the same elective office by filing an amended State Form No. 410 (Statement of Organization) to include the new election year, and an initial State Form No. 501 (Candidate Intention). The defeated candidate or individual leaving office shall also file a statement with the Commission that campaign account funds have been redesignated.

(c) Redesignation to a Different Elective Office

The treasurer shall certify that to his or her knowledge there remains no further outstanding indebtedness in connection with the campaign. A defeated candidate or individual leaving office shall redesignate campaign funds for a future election to a different elective office by closing the existing campaign bank account and opening a new campaign bank account for the new elective office, and shall file initial State Forms No. 410 and 501.

Subject: Amendments to the Berkeley Election Reform Act

RECOMMENDATION

Conduct a public hearing and upon conclusion, adopt an ordinance amending the Berkeley Elections Reform Act, BMC Chapter 2.12, regarding the public financing program.

FISCAL IMPACTS OF RECOMMENDATION None.

CURRENT SITUATION AND ITS EFFECTS

The proposed amendments to the Berkeley Election Reform Act (BERA) were adopted by the Fair Campaign Practices Commission (FCPC) at its regular meeting of May 16, 2019.

Action: M/S/C (/) to adopt the proposed amendments to BERA related to public financing.

Vote:

Pursuant to Berkeley Municipal Code Section 2.12.051, the BERA may be amended by the "double green light" process. This process requires that the FCPC adopt the amendments by a two-thirds vote and the City Council hold a public hearing and adopt the amendments by a two-thirds vote.

BACKGROUND

In the November 2018 election cycle the public financing program was used for the first time. The lessons learned from the initial implementation of the public financing program and other campaign finance issues have surfaced the need for amendments to BERA. City staff consulted with representatives from MapLight, the original sponsors of the Fair Elections Act of 2016, regarding the types of changes staff identified. In these discussions, many of the amendments identified by staff were similar to the issues raised by MapLight and campaign committees that participated in public financing in 2018. The proposed amendments are listed and explained below.

1. Violations prior to statement of participation

In the 2018 election, multiple candidates experienced difficulty with starting up their committee and opening their checking account. The \$50 limit resulted in several inadvertent minor violations of the public financing regulations and actually resulted in one candidate being barred from participation in the program. Many candidates start by opening a checking account first, and some banks require a minimum initial deposit of \$100.

The proposed amendment allows a candidate to contribute up to \$250 to their own committee, but makes these contributions ineligible for matching funds. This amendment strikes a balance between allowing higher contributions from candidates, but maintains the purposes of the Fair Elections Act. The FCPC noted that candidate contributions to their own committee do not demonstrate community support of their candidacy in the same manner as a contribution from a Berkeley resident.

Proposed Remedy: Amend BERA 2.12.500.A.6.

- A. To be eligible to be certified as a participating candidate, a candidate must:
- 6) Not make expenditures from or use his or her personal funds or funds jointly held with his or her spouse, domestic partner, or unemancipated children in connection with his or her election except as a qualified monetary or non-monetary contribution to his or her controlled committee of \$250 or less. Contributions from a participating candidate to his or her own controlled committee are not eligible for matching funds. A Participating Candidate may make non-monetary contributions to his or her controlled committee. However, the aggregate amount of a Participating Candidate's monetary and non-monetary contributions to his or her controlled committee must not be greater than fifty dollars (\$50);

2. Remove requirement for FCPC to approve matching funds – administrative process and approval only.

This change furthers the purposes of the public financing program by reducing the timeline from submission to payment from 17 days to 7 days.

No payments were denied by the commission in the 2018 election cycle. The review and verification of the hundreds of individual contributions that are eligible for matching funds is a time-consuming administrative process that is infeasible for the commission to perform. Faster distribution of matching funds will benefit participating candidates and this change will also eliminate the

occurrence of delayed payments due cancelled meetings, as was the case in November 2018 during the wildfires.

City staff will process matching requests and distribute the funds according to the distribution schedule adopted by the FCPC and continue to provide the commission with detailed summaries of all public financing requests and itemized reports of the matching funds submissions and their status. The Commission would maintain its authority to approve candidates' initial applications to participate in the public financing program.

Proposed Remedy: Amend Section 2.12.505, Paragraphs D, E, and G.

- D. The Commission City shall verify that a candidate's qualified contributions meet all of the requirements and restrictions of this Act prior to the disbursement of Fair Elections funds to the candidate. A participating candidate who receives a qualified contribution that is not from the person listed on the qualified contribution receipt shall be liable to pay the Fair Elections Fund the entire amount of the inaccurately identified contribution, in addition to any penalties.
- E. The <u>Commission City</u> shall make an initial payment of Fair Elections funds within seven business days of the Commission's certification of a participating candidate's eligibility, or as soon thereafter as is practicable.
- G. The Commission-City shall provide each participating candidate with a written determination specifying the basis for any non-payment of Fair Elections funds. The Commission shall provide participating candidates with a process by which they may immediately upon receipt of such determination petition the Commission for reconsideration of any such non-payment and such reconsideration shall occur within seven business days of the filing of such petition. In the event that the Commission denies such petition then it shall immediately notify the candidate of his or her right to seek judicial review of the Commission's denial pursuant to Section 2.12.235.

3. Change 2.12.530.B.2 to clarify the prohibited uses of public matching funds.

The changes to this section arise, in part, from a difficult question from a candidate regarding a mailer that they planned to send that included voting recommendations on other candidates and measures. The proposed "direct personal benefit" language is from Fair Political Practices Commission State Manual 2, and the reference to BERA's definition of an independent expenditure is for additional clarification.

Proposed Remedy: Amend section 2.12.530 (Use of Fair Elections funds).

- A. A participating candidate shall use Fair Elections funds and contributions only for direct campaign purposes.
- B. A participating candidate shall not use Fair Elections funds or contributions for:
 - Costs of legal defense in any campaign law enforcement proceeding under this Act, or penalties arising from violations of any local, state, or federal campaign laws;
 - 2) The candidate's personal support or compensation to the candidate or the candidate's family;
 - 3) Indirect campaign purposes, including but not limited to:
 - a) The candidate's personal support or compensation to the candidate or the candidate's family:
 - ba) Any expense that provides a direct personal benefit to the candidate, including Cclothing and other items related to the candidate's personal appearance;
 - eb) Capital assets having a value in excess of five hundred dollars (\$500) and useful life extending beyond the end of the current election period determined in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles;
 - A contribution or loan to the campaign committee of another candidate or to a party committee or other political committee;
 - ed) An independent expenditure as defined in Berkeley Municipal Code Section 2.12.142 as may be amended;
 - **fe**) Any payment or transfer for which compensating value is not received:
- C. The term "Contribution" is defined in <u>2.12.100</u> and includes "Qualified Contributions" as defined in <u>2.12.167</u> and contributions from non-residents of Berkeley as described in <u>2.12.500</u>.A.7.

4. Timing of requests submitted, especially at qualifying period deadline.

When a candidate participates in the public financing program, a sentence is added to his or her candidate statement (published in ballot materials) indicating this participation. In 2018, a candidate submitted an application for participation by the qualification deadline and thus had the sentence stating her participation included with their candidate statement. However, she subsequently decided not to participate in program and did not submit an initial qualifying request. By the time the City was aware that the candidate would not participate, it was too late to remove the participation sentence from their candidate statement. This amendment will require the candidate to submit their qualifying request before the end of qualifying period.

Proposed Remedy: Amend BERA 2.12.500.A.3

3) Before the close of the qualifying period, collect <u>and submit</u> at least 30 qualified contributions, from at least 30 unique contributors, of at least ten dollars (\$10), for a total dollar amount of at least five-hundred dollars (\$500).

5. Amendment to prohibit all loans.

This change is needed for consistency and clarity. The definition of a Qualified Contribution excludes loans, however, no similar restriction is made on a contribution from a non-resident. Loans are inconsistent with public financing programs since the matching funds and contributions are not accounted for separately by participating committees.

Proposed Remedy: Add BERA 2.12.500.A.9

9) Not accept loans from any source.

6. Discretion for FCPC on Disqualifying Violations

Related to the issues that were raised regarding startup problems and inadvertent, minor disqualifying actions by campaign committees, it is warranted to grant the FCPC some discretion in enforcement of certain Public Financing requirements.

Proposed Remedy: Add Paragraph (10) to Section 2.12.500 (Eligibility for Fair Elections campaign funding)

(10) The Commission has the authority to approve a candidate's application for public financing, despite a violation by the candidate related to participation and qualification in the public financing program, if the violation is minor in scope and the candidate demonstrates a timely, good-faith effort to remedy the violation.

The Commission may adopt regulations setting forth guidelines for what constitutes a minor violation under this provision.

ENVIRONMENTAL SUSTAINABILITY

There are no identifiable environmental effects related to the recommendation in this report.

RATIONALE FOR RECOMMENDATION

The proposed amendments to BERA will provide expanded access to the program, provide clarifying language for several passages, and allow for some additional discretion regarding minor violations to assist non-professional treasurers.

ORDINANCE NO. -N.S.

AMENDMENTS TO THE BERKELEY ELECTION REFORM ACT RELATED TO PUBLIC FINANCING FOR CAMPAIGNS

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Berkeley as follows:

<u>Section 1.</u> That Berkeley Municipal Code Section 2.12.500 is amended to read as follows:

2.12.500 Eligibility for Fair Elections campaign funding.

- A. To be eligible to be certified as a participating candidate, a candidate must:
- 1) During the qualifying period for the election involved, choose to participate in the Fair Elections program by filing with the Commission a written application for certification as a participating candidate in such form as may be prescribed by the Commission, containing the identity of the candidate, the office that the candidate seeks, and the candidate's signature, under penalty of perjury, certifying that:
- a) The candidate has complied with the restrictions of this chapter during the election cycle to date;
- b) The candidate's campaign committee has filed all campaign finance reports required by law during the election cycle to date and that they are complete and accurate; and
- c) The candidate will comply with the requirements of this Act during the remainder of the election cycle and, specifically, if certified an eligible participating candidate, will comply with the requirements applicable to participating candidates.
- 2) Meet all requirements to be eligible to hold the office of Mayor or Councilmember as set forth in Sections 9 and 10 of Article V of the Charter of the City of Berkeley;
- 3) Before the close of the qualifying period, collect <u>and submit</u> at least 30 qualified contributions, from at least 30 unique contributors, of at least ten dollars (\$10), for a total dollar amount of at least five-hundred dollars (\$500).
- a) Each qualified contribution shall be acknowledged by a receipt to the contributor, with a copy retained by the candidate. The receipt shall include the contributor's signature, printed name, home address, and telephone number, if any, and the name of the candidate on whose behalf the contribution is made. In addition, the receipt shall indicate by the contributor's signature that the contributor understands that the purpose of the qualified contribution is to help the candidate qualify for Fair Elections campaign funding and that the contribution is made without coercion or reimbursement.

- b) A contribution for which a candidate has not obtained a signed and fully completed receipt shall not be counted as a qualified contribution.
- 4) Maintain such records of receipts and expenditures as required by the Commission;
- 5) Obtain and furnish to the Commission any information it may request relating to his or her campaign expenditures or contributions and furnish such documentation and other proof of compliance with this chapter as may be requested by such Commission;
- 6) Not make expenditures from or use his or her personal funds or funds jointly held with his or her spouse, domestic partner, or unemancipated children in connection with his or her election except as a qualified monetary or non-monetary contribution to his or her controlled committee of \$250 or less. Contributions from a participating candidate to his or her own controlled committee are not eligible for matching funds. A Participating Candidate may make non-monetary contributions to his or her controlled committee. However, the aggregate amount of a Participating Candidate's monetary and non-monetary contributions to his or her controlled committee must not be greater than fifty dollars (\$50);
- 7) Not accept contributions in connection with the election for which Fair Elections funds are sought other than qualified contributions, contributions not greater than fifty dollars (\$50) made by a natural person non-resident of Berkeley, or non-monetary contributions with a fair market value not greater than fifty dollars (\$50). The aggregate value of all contributions from any individual must not be greater than fifty dollars (\$50);
- 8) Not solicit or direct contributions in connection with any election during the election cycle in which Fair Elections funds are sought other than qualified contributions, contributions not greater than fifty dollars (\$50) made by a natural person non-resident of Berkeley, or non-monetary contributions with fair market value not greater than fifty dollars (\$50) to such candidate's controlled committee.
- 9) Not accept loans from any source.
- (10) The Commission has the authority to approve a candidate's application for public financing, despite a violation by the candidate related to participation and qualification in the public financing program, if the violation is minor in scope and the candidate demonstrates a timely, good-faith effort to remedy the violation. The Commission may adopt regulations setting forth guidelines for what constitutes a minor violation under this provision.

<u>Section 2.</u> That Berkeley Municipal Code Section 2.12.505 is amended to read as follows:

2.12.505 Fair Elections fund payments.

A. A candidate who is certified as an eligible participating candidate shall receive payment of Fair Elections funds equal to six-hundred percent (600 percent) of the

amount of qualified contributions received by the candidate during the election cycle with respect to a single election subject to the aggregate limit on the total amount of Fair Elections funds payments to a candidate specified in Section 2.12.505.B.

- B. The aggregate amount of Fair Elections funds payments that may be made to a participating candidate during an election cycle may not exceed:
- 1) \$120,000 for a candidate running for the office of Mayor;
- 2) \$40,000 for a candidate running for the office of City Council.
- C. A participating candidate's application for Fair Elections funds, including an initial request submitted with an application for certification as a participating candidate, shall be made using a form prescribed by the Commission and shall be accompanied by qualified contribution receipts and any other information the Commission deems necessary. This application shall be accompanied by a signed statement from the candidate indicating that all information on the qualified contribution receipts is complete and accurate to the best of the candidate's knowledge.
- 1) All Qualified Contributions, of any dollar amount, eligible for matching Fair Elections funds must be publically disclosed with the contributor information required under Sections 2.12.280 and 2.12.283.
- 2) All campaign filings must be current in order for a Participating Candidate to receive a disbursement of Fair Elections funds and the Participating Candidate and a Participating Candidate's controlled committee must not have any outstanding fines related to campaign filings or violations of municipal, state or federal election law. All applications for Fair Elections funds shall include a certification by the Participating Candidate that the Participating Candidate or his or her controlled committee does not have any outstanding fines or penalties related to campaign filings. Upon submission of outstanding campaign filings and payment of any outstanding fines, withheld Fair Elections funds will be disbursed at the next regularly scheduled distribution for that election cycle.
- D. The Commission City shall verify that a candidate's qualified contributions meet all of the requirements and restrictions of this Act prior to the disbursement of Fair Elections funds to the candidate. A participating candidate who receives a qualified contribution that is not from the person listed on the qualified contribution receipt shall be liable to pay the Fair Elections Fund the entire amount of the inaccurately identified contribution, in addition to any penalties.
- E. The Commission City shall make an initial payment of Fair Elections funds within seven business days of the Commission's certification of a participating candidate's eligibility, or as soon thereafter as is practicable.

- F. The Commission shall establish a schedule for the submission of Fair Elections funds payment requests, permitting a candidate to submit a Fair Elections funds payment request at least once per month. However, the Commission shall schedule a minimum of three payment request submission dates within the thirty days prior to an election.
- G. The Commission City shall provide each participating candidate with a written determination specifying the basis for any non-payment of Fair Elections funds. The Commission shall provide participating candidates with a process by which they may immediately upon receipt of such determination petition the Commission for reconsideration of any such non-payment and such reconsideration shall occur within seven business days of the filing of such petition. In the event that the Commission denies such petition then it shall immediately notify the candidate of his or her right to seek judicial review of the Commission's denial pursuant to Section 2.12.235.
- H. Unspent funds of any Participating Candidate who does not remain a candidate until the election for which they were distributed, or such funds that remain unspent by a Participating Candidate following the date of the election for which they were distributed shall be deposited into the Fair Elections Fund. A Participating Candidate shall deposit all unspent funds into the Fair Elections Fund, up to the total amount of funds that the Participating Candidate received as Fair Elections Fund distributions in that election cycle, within sixty (60) days after the date of the election.

<u>Section 3.</u> That Berkeley Municipal Code Section 2.12.530 is amended to read as follows:

2.12.530 Use of Fair Elections funds.

- A. A participating candidate shall use Fair Elections funds and contributions only for direct campaign purposes.
- B. A participating candidate shall not use Fair Elections funds or contributions for:
 - Costs of legal defense in any campaign law enforcement proceeding under this Act, or penalties arising from violations of any local, state, or federal campaign laws;
 - 2) The candidate's personal support or compensation to the candidate or the candidate's family;
 - 3) Indirect campaign purposes, including but not limited to:
 - a) The candidate's personal support or compensation to the candidate or the candidate's family;
 - <u>Sclothing</u> and other items related to the candidate's personal appearance;
 - eb) Capital assets having a value in excess of five hundred dollars (\$500) and useful life extending beyond the end of the current election period determined in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles;
 - dc) A contribution or loan to the campaign committee of another candidate or to a party committee or other political committee;

- ed) An independent expenditure as defined in Berkeley Municipal Code Section 2.12.142 as may be amended;
- (e) Any payment or transfer for which compensating value is not received:
- C. The term "Contribution" is defined in <u>2.12.100</u> and includes "Qualified Contributions" as defined in <u>2.12.167</u> and contributions from non-residents of Berkeley as described in <u>2.12.500</u>.A.7.

<u>Section 4.</u> Copies of this Ordinance shall be posted for two days prior to adoption in the display case located near the walkway in front of the Maudelle Shirek Building, 2134 Martin Luther King Jr. Way. Within 15 days of adoption, copies of this Ordinance shall be filed at each branch of the Berkeley Public Library and the title shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation.

SUBJECT: Staff Report Regarding Potential Violation of the Berkeley Election

Reform Act by Greg Magofna for Berkeley City Council 2018

This referral from the City Clerk's office relates to a candidate's potential misuse of public-financing program funds for the purchase of a \$150 ticket to a Democratic Party fundraiser.

The item was included on the agenda for the Commission's November 15, 2018, meeting, which was subsequently cancelled. This is the first time the Commission will discuss and potentially take action on the referral. It is also the first time the Commission handles a matter dealing with improper use of public-financing funds.

For the reasons below, staff recommends the Commission find probable cause of a violation and request staff enter into a stipulation with the candidate that requires him to repay the \$150 ticket fee to the City's Fair Elections Fund.

I. Background

Greg Magofna was a candidate for City Council in 2018 who participated in the City's public-financing program, the Fair Elections Act. On November 5, 2018, the candidate's committee, Greg Magofna for Berkeley City Council 2018, filed an amended Form 460 for the period of Sept. 23 to Oct. 20, 2018. (**See Attachment 1**.) The amended Form 460 listed a \$150 payment to ActBlue that was described as "Admission fee for Democratic fundraiser." (**Attachment 1**, page 9.)

Later that day, the candidate contacted the City Clerk's office regarding the expenditure. (**Attachment 2**.) Anticipating that the payment was the subject of a forthcoming complaint against him, Mr. Magofna explained that the payment was for "a ticket to the Alameda County Democratic Unity Dinner." (*Id.*) Mr. Magofna indicated that he did not know that the payment constituted a violation of the Berkeley Elections Reform Act (BERA) but that, if it did constitute a violation, it was "completely by mistake" and was

not committed knowingly. (*Id.*) He stated he wanted to rectify any violation immediately and asked how to proceed. (*Id.*)

On November 6, 2018, the City Clerk identified the expenditure as a contribution potentially in violation of Berkeley Municipal Code (BMC) section 2.12.530(B)(2)(d), which prohibits public-financing candidates from using Fair Elections funds for contributions to party committees. (**See Attachment 3**.) The Clerk referred the matter to the Commission.

The specific dinner in question was the Alameda County Democratic Party's 48th Annual Unity Dinner, which took place on September 29, 2018. (See Attachments 4 & 5.) The event's website and social media postings advertise the annual dinner as "the premier fundraising event for the Alameda County Democratic Party." (*Id.*) The webpage through which attendees purchased tickets stated that attendees' "Individual Ticket or Sponsorship will benefit the Alameda County Democratic Central Committee Federal Account: FEC # C00375279." (Attachment 6.) Similarly, the receipt that Mr. Magofna received after purchasing the ticket (and which he later provided to staff) stated "Thank you for your contribution in support of Alameda County Democratic Party (CA) – Federal!" (Attachment 7.)

The Statement of Organization filed by the Alameda County Democratic Central Committee with the Federal Elections Commission in 2017 confirms it is a local committee of the Democratic Party. (Attachment 8.)

II. Alleged BERA violation

The Prohibited Use of Public Funds

The Fair Elections Act restricts how public-financing candidates may use the public funds they receive and makes clear that it is unlawful for candidates to "misuse" these funds. (BMC § 2.12.550.B.).

The prohibited uses of Fair Elections funds are enumerated in BMC section 2.12.530.B, which specifically prohibits participating candidates from using the funds for "indirect campaign purposes, including . . . [a] contribution or loan to the campaign committee of another candidate or to a party committee or other political committee." (BMC § 2.12.530.B.2.d.)

The applicable definition of "contribution" is based on the general BERA definition. (BMC § 2.12.530.C.) This generally includes any gift "made directly or indirectly in aid of or in opposition to the nomination or election of one or more candidates," and specifically "includes the purchase of tickets for events such as dinners, luncheons, rallies and similar fund-raising events." (*Id.* § 2.12.100.)

Potential Penalties under BERA

A violation of the Fair Elections Act's prohibited uses provision is potentially subject to three somewhat complementary penalties provisions under BERA.

- First, is the general penalty provision of BERA (which overall is codified at chapter 2.12 of the Municipal Code): "Any person who knowingly or willfully violates any provision of this chapter is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine for each violation of three times the amount the person failed to report properly, or unlawfully contributed, expended, gave or received." (BMC § 2.12.460.)
- Second, is the general penalty provision applicable to violations found following a Commission hearing on the complaint: "[T]he Commission may order" the violating party to cease its violations, file any required reports under BERA, and "[p]ay a monetary penalty of up to \$1,000 per violation, or up to the amount or value of the unlawful or undisclosed contribution or expenditure, whichever is greater, to the Fair Elections Fund of the City." (BMC § 2.12.231.)
- Third, is the specific penalty provision applicable to violations of the Fair Elections Act found following a Commission hearing on the complaint: "If a participating candidate knowingly or willfully accepts or spends Fair Elections funding in violation of this Act, then the candidate shall repay to the Fair Elections Fund an amount equal to twice the value of Fair Elections funding unlawfully accepted or spent." (Id. § 2.12.550.B-C.)

III. FCPC Procedural Guidance

Under section V.B.2 of the Commission's procedures, upon receipt of this referral, the Commission has three options. It "shall decide: (a) whether to direct the Secretary to investigate the complaint, to the extent the Secretary has not already done so; (b) whether to dismiss the complaint; or (c) whether to find probable cause to believe a provision of the BERA has been violated." (Procedures for the FCPC § VI.B.2.)

For option (c), the procedures specify that "[p]robable cause exists when based on the circumstances presented there is a reasonable basis on which to believe that a violation of the BERA has occurred." (*Id.* § VI.B.2.)

If the Commission finds probable cause that a violation has occurred, it "may take any of the following courses of action":

- a. Dismiss the complaint, where appropriate, and take no further action.
- b. Request the Secretary conduct further investigation, including an audit of campaign records;
- c. Require the timely filing of campaign statements and/or amendments to campaign statements if the probable violation involves an error and/or an

- omission on a campaign statement that has been filed, or if it involves the failure to file a campaign statement as required;
- d. Invite the respondents to participate in settlement negotiations. The Commission may request that the Secretary participate in negotiations on behalf of the Commission. Alternatively, the Chairperson may appoint a negotiating committee, which shall be guided by the Commission regarding the desired outcome of the settlement. Any settlement reached by the Secretary or negotiating committee and respondent(s) shall be presented to the commission for approval. Negotiations between the designated negotiator or negotiating committee and the respondent shall be confidential. Only the negotiated draft settlement agreement, or the fact of an impasse, shall be shared with the Commission.
- e. Schedule and conduct a hearing pursuant to Section 2.12.230 of BERA. The hearing shall be conducted in accordance with Part VII below after 12 the Secretary has completed his or her report. However, the hearing must be conducted within a reasonable time after a determination of probable cause.
- f. Ask the City Attorney or the District Attorney to seek legal remedies.
- g. Seek any other remedy within its authority.

(*Id.* § VI.C.2.)

When deciding upon the appropriate action, the Commission may take into consideration the following factors:

- a. Its policies, procedures, regulations, and past actions in similar situations.
- b. The amount of experience of the candidate, if any, and treasurer in campaign reporting, the history or absence of other campaign violations, and the degree to which these persons made good faith efforts to correct any relevant reporting deficiencies.
- c. The presence, if any, of an apparent intent to conceal, deceive or mislead.
- d. Whether the probable violation appears deliberate, negligent or inadvertent.
- e. The effect of the probable violation upon the election or upon the administration of BERA.

(Id. § VI.C.1.)

IV. Staff Analysis and Recommendation

It is undisputed here that the Committee made a \$150.00 expenditure for admission to the September 29, 2018, event. The event's website clearly indicated that ticket proceeds would benefit the Alameda County Democratic Central Committee, which is a local party committee. Under BERA, this expenditure is thus considered a contribution to a party committee, which is a prohibited use of Fair Elections funds under BMC section 2.12.530.B.2.d.

As to the factors the Commission should consider in deciding on the appropriate action to take, staff believes these tilt to a stipulation with a minimal penalty. The violation is relatively minor and was committed by a first-time candidate who proactively reached out to the Clerk's office to determine if there was a violation and to correct the violation.

In addition, there was no attempt to conceal or mislead, and the violation appears inadvertent. The expenditure was fully disclosed in the Committee's Form 460, which described the expenditure as a payment for admission to a Democratic Party fundraiser. The candidate explained that he did not believe that the payment constituted a BERA violation, but that if it did, he wanted to rectify the violation as soon as possible. He reiterated again in an email to the Commission staff secretary in March 2019 that any violation was a mistake and that he understood that other candidates (ostensibly not public-financing candidates) had used campaign funds to purchase tickets to the same event. (Attachment 9.)

Finally, there is no indication the violation – for a \$150 ticket to a countywide fundraiser apparently conducted for purposes outside of the City Council election – had any effect on the election.

For many of these same reasons, there is no evidence indicating that this violation was "knowing or willful" such that the Commission should move to impose a penalty beyond requiring the candidate to return the funds.

As a result, staff recommends the Commission take two actions: (1) find probable cause of a violation of BMC section 2.12.530.B; and (2) request that staff engage in negotiations with the candidate to enter into a stipulation that admits a violation occurred and requires the candidate to return the \$150 payment to the City's Fair Elections Fund.

The City of Berkeley Fair Campaign Practices Commission ("FCPC") is tasked under the Berkeley Election Reform Act ("BERA") with determining whether required campaign documents were filed and, if so, whether they conform on their face with requirements of BERA. See Berkeley Municipal Code ("BMC") § 2.12.215.

In furtherance of these duties, I have reviewed your committee's Form 460 campaign statements filed October 25, 2018, and November 5, 2018 (Amendment), covering the period from September 23, 2018, through October 20, 2018. I am contacting you regarding items that appear to be noncompliant with BERA.

(1) Potentially prohibited expenditure.

The campaign statement reflects an expenditure that may violate BERA's expenditure prohibition. BMC Section 2.12.530 prohibits Public Finance candidates from using Fair Elections funds on certain items.

The following expenditure may be in violation of this section: \$150 expenditure to ActBlue to purchase "Admission fee for Democratic fundraiser." BMC Section 2.12.530 states that candidates may not make a contribution "to a party committee." The committee indicated in an email to the City Clerk on November 5, 2018, that the \$150 charge was for a ticket to the Alameda County Democratic Unity Dinner of September 29, 2018.

This potentially prohibited expenditure has been referred to the Fair Campaign Practices Commission (FCPC) for further investigation. You may contact the FCPC Secretary at 510-981-6998 or fcpc@cityofberkeley.info if you have questions regarding this matter.



Election Reform Act by Harrison for City Council 2018 submitted by

This complaint relates to the use of City resources in the 2018 election for City Council. Complainant alleges that an incumbent candidate improperly used an email distribution list acquired through her elected office for campaign purposes, and that her staff used City resources to send campaign emails. Because the City is a municipal corporation and the alleged services could constitute "contributions" under the Berkeley Election Reform Act, such allegations, if true, could be read to violate the prohibition on contributions from corporations and the prohibition on public-financing candidates receiving non-monetary contributions of more than \$50.

For the reasons stated below, staff secretary concludes that there is no evidence to support these allegations or to support a finding that the candidate violated BERA's contribution restrictions.

However, the investigation has shown that the Committee used public funds received through the Fair Elections Act to pay for email marketing services related to the candidate's role as a City elected officer (i.e., for maintaining an officeholder email distribution list and sending district newsletters). Because participating candidates may use public funds only for direct campaign purposes, and not for officeholder purposes, the staff secretary recommends the Commission find probable cause of a violation of the Fair Elections Act. The staff secretary makes no recommendation as to how to proceed following such a finding.

I. <u>Background</u>

A. Complaint

On October 25, 2018, the Commission received a revised complaint from Laura Menard against the committee *Kate Harrison for City Council 2018* ("the Committee"), the candidate controlled committee of then-incumbent Councilmember Kate Harrison. (**Attachment 1**.) The complaint made two related allegations: First, "Ms. Harrison has been routinely using her email list accumulated as a city council person to distribute literature and communications of her run for re-election." Second, that Ms. Harrison's "staff member M. Rosen is sending out emails with a disclaimer of 'Paid for by Kate Harrison of [sic] City Council 2018." The complaint enclosed two emails sent by the Committee to support its claims. (**Attachment 1**, pp. 2-9.)

The complaint was placed on the agenda for the Commission's meeting of November 15, 2018, which was canceled due to unhealthy air quality. It was to be heard at the April 18, 2019 meeting, but at the request of Ms. Harrison ("Respondent") was postponed until the May 16, 2019 meeting.

B. Staff Determination

As an initial matter, the staff secretary reviewed the complaint to determine if it alleged a violation of the Berkeley Elections Reform Act ("BERA") within the Commission's subject-matter jurisdiction. (See Procedures for the FCPC, § V.A.4.) The staff secretary understood the complaint to allege that (1) the Committee may have used a city email distribution list for campaign purposes, and (2) Committee staff may have used their City email accounts and staff time to send campaign emails. While the underlying thrust of these allegations relate to improper use of City resources—a legal issue outside of BERA's scope¹—the staff secretary determined the complaint could be read to raise BERA violations. Specifically, it could be read to allege that the Committee received improper contributions from the City of Berkeley in the form of an email distribution list, the sending of emails using City resources, and City staff labor. The staff secretary then conducted an investigation.

C. Investigation

This investigation included: reviewing the complaint; discussing the City's email list policies with the City's Public Information Officer; reviewing the Committee's Form 460s; reviewing information received from the Committee in response to questions sent; and browsing the websites of various City elected officials and the Action Network website.

¹ See Berkeley Municipal Code ("BMC") § 4.04.200 ("There shall be no improper political activity on the part of City employees. City employees may not engage in political activities or services of any nature during these hours in which they are employed by the City; nor shall City funds, supplies, property or equipment be utilized in performing any services of a political nature."); see also Govt. Code §§ 8314, 54964.

No Official City Lists. According to the City's Public Information Officer, the City does not provide email distribution lists to Councilmembers, the Mayor, or any other elected official in the City to communicate with constituents. Nor does it maintain or host such lists. Rather, any email distribution lists used by Councilmembers for communicating with constituents are collected and maintained by their Council staff. The staff secretary reviewed the City's webpages for the Mayor and Councilmembers (often linking to privately hosted websites); all but one of these offered constituents a means to sign up for district newsletters. Based on the forms used to sign up, it appears that most Councilmembers use third-party email marketing services such as Constant Contact to maintain email distribution lists for newsletter purposes. Ms. Harrison's webpage contains a link to sign up for her office's monthly newsletter, which leads to a sign-up page on the Action Network's website. (Att. 2.)

Emails in Complaint. Two emails were enclosed with the complaint. The first email emails (with the subject "People versus Money") was sent by the email address campaign@electkateharrison.com using the Action Network. (Att. 1, at p. 2.) The email discusses opposition to Harrison's 2018 City Council campaign and solicits help from volunteers. The email contains an FPPC disclaimer at the end stating that the email was "Paid for by Kate Harrison for City Council 2018. FPPC # 1392842." It also contains a footer, stating, in part, "to stop receiving emails from Kate Harrison, Berkeley City Council, please click here" and including a hyperlink. (Id.)

The second email (subject "July Newsletter: Change in Action") was sent by the email address mrosen@cityofberkeley.info also through the Action Network. (Att. 1, at p. 3.) The email contains a newsletter reporting on various policy issues in the City of Berkeley (housing, homelessness, emergency preparedness, and pension liabilities), the Councilmember's office's work in responding to constituent requests, and highlighting a local business in the Councilmember's district. (Id., at pp. 3-9.) The newsletter contains the same FPPC disclaimer as the other email included with the complaint, but with the additional language: "Want to opt-out of campaign emails but still receive council updates? Click here." (Id., at p. 9 [emphasis added].) The email also contains the same footer as the other email, stating that it was sent by Kate Harrison, Berkeley City Council via the Action Network. (Ibid.)

The Committee's Email Lists & Services. According to a letter from James Hendry, the Committee's assistant treasurer, Ms. Harrison has an account with the Action Network that she opened during her first election to the City Council in 2017. (Att. 3, at p. 3; Att. 4, at p. 3.) According to Mr. Hendry, this one account hosts "different segregated email lists" that are used to send district newsletters and campaign communications. (Att. 3, at p. 3; Att. 4, at p. 3.) According to Mr. Hendry, "Ms. Harrison has generated her own mailing lists" without City funds, using an email list she had collected before running for Council in 2017, as well as supplemental data that the Committee collected or paid for as part of her campaigns. (Att. 3, pp. 2-3.)

According to Mr. Hendry, "No City funds have been used to generate or maintain Kate Harrison's email distribution lists," and "Ms. Harrison has never spent any city or other public funds to pay for the email service she uses." (Att. 4, p. 3.) Rather, the Committee paid the Action Network's full monthly fees during Ms. Harrison's first campaign, after she was elected, and throughout her second campaign.² (*Id.*) Pursuant to the rules for public-funding candidates, the Committee returned unused campaign funds after the 2018 campaign, and Ms. Harrison has since paid the Action Network monthly fees from her personal funds. (*Id.*, p. 4.)

Roles of Council v. Campaign Staff. Mr. Hendry stated that "[a]ll of Ms. Harrison's city staff are part-time" employees. (Att. 3, p. 3.) At least one staff member, Michael Rosen, also worked "under contract as a campaign staff member in his time away from City employment." (Id.) According to Mr. Hendry, "Mr. Rosen sent many emails in his capacity as a campaign employee" from campaign@electkateharrison.com and with a disclaimer that the emails were paid for by the Committee. (Id.)

As for the email newsletter attached to the complaint that was sent from Mr. Rosen's City email address, Mr. Hendry explained that Mr. Rosen sent this email in his capacity as a City employee and that it was "a simple mistake" for the email to have been sent with the "paid for Kate Harrison for Berkeley City Council" disclaimer. (*Id.*)

Ms. Harrison has provided invoices for Mr. Rosen's campaign services (**Att. 6**), as well as an accounting of "District 4 City expenditures from which email services might come (but didn't in [her] case)" – professional services, books and subscriptions, and printing and binding (**Att. 7**).

II. Applicable Law (BERA)

A. Prohibited Contributions

The allegations of the complaint relate to two BERA's restrictions on permissible contributions:

First, BERA prohibits candidates in municipal elections from receiving contributions from any "proprietorship, firm, partnership, joint venture, syndicate, business trust, company, corporation, including non-profit corporations, or labor union." (BMC § 2.12.440.) The City of Berkeley is a municipal corporation. (See Berkeley City Charter, art. I, § 1.)

² This is consistent with the Committee's Form 460s, which show monthly payments beginning in February or March 2017 and continuing for each month throughout 2017 and 2018. (Att. 5, at pp. 21, 22, 24, 25, 27, 29, 47, 50, 54, 72, 101, 106 [Form 460 records for 2018]; see also all Form 460 records submitted by Committee at https://public.netfile.com/Pub2/AllFilingsByFiler.aspx?id=162332920.) The Committee's records show monthly fees of \$15 for the Action Network throughout 2018. (*Id.*)

Second, participating candidates in the City's public-financing program, the Fair Elections Act of 2016, may receive a non-monetary contribution from a non-natural person only if the contribution is not prohibited by BERA and has a fair market value of \$50 or less.³ (BMC § 2.12.500.A.1.c & 2.12.500.A.7.)

For both of these provisions, BERA defines a "contribution" as "a gift, subscription, loan, advance, deposit, pledge, forgiveness of indebtedness, payment of a debt by a third party, contract, agreement, or promise of money or anything of value or other obligation, whether or not legally enforceable, made directly or indirectly in aid of or in opposition to the nomination or election of one or more candidates or the qualification for the ballot or voter approval of one or more measures." (BMC § 2.12.100.) While "a gift of service or labor" is not a contribution, any "service or labor for which a payment is made" is a non-monetary contribution under BERA. (*Id.*)

B. Prohibited Use of Fair Elections Act Funds

In addition to restrictions on contributions, the Fair Elections Act restricts how public-financing candidates may use the public funds they receive and makes clear that it is unlawful for candidates to "misuse" these funds. (BMC § 2.12.550.B.) Under BMC section 2.12.530.A, public funds may be used "only for direct campaign purposes." By contrast, participating candidates may not use the funds for "indirect campaign purposes." (BMC § 2.12.530.B.2.d.)

C. Potential Penalties under BERA

A violation of the Fair Elections Act's prohibited uses provision is potentially subject to three somewhat complementary penalties provisions under BERA.

- First, is the general penalty provision of BERA (which overall is codified at chapter 2.12 of the Municipal Code): "Any person who knowingly or willfully violates any provision of this chapter is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine for each violation of three times the amount the person failed to report properly, or unlawfully contributed, expended, gave or received." (BMC § 2.12.460.)
- Second, is the general penalty provision applicable to violations found following a Commission hearing on the complaint: "[T]he Commission may order" the violating party to cease its violations, file any required reports under BERA, and "[p]ay a monetary penalty of up to \$1,000 per violation, or up to the amount or

³ Ms. Harrison was a participating candidate in the Fair Elections Act for the 2018 election cycle. The Commission certified her participation and approved matching funds at its January 18, 2018 meeting. (Minutes of FCPC Jan. 18, 2018 Meeting, available at https://www.cityofberkeley.info/uploadedFiles/Attorney/Commissions/Commission_on_F air Campaign Practices/Approved%201%2018%2018%20FCPC%20Minutes.pdf.)

- value of the unlawful or undisclosed contribution or expenditure, whichever is greater, to the Fair Elections Fund of the City." (BMC § 2.12.231.)
- Third, is the specific penalty provision applicable to violations of the Fair Elections Act found following a Commission hearing on the complaint: "If a participating candidate knowingly or willfully accepts or spends Fair Elections funding in violation of this Act, then the candidate shall repay to the Fair Elections Fund an amount equal to twice the value of Fair Elections funding unlawfully accepted or spent." (Id. § 2.12.550.B-C.)

III. FCPC Procedural Guidance

Under section V.B.2 of the Commission's procedures, upon receipt of this complaint, the Commission has three options. It "shall decide: (a) whether to direct the Secretary to investigate the complaint, to the extent the Secretary has not already done so; (b) whether to dismiss the complaint; or (c) whether to find probable cause to believe a provision of the BERA has been violated." (Procedures for the FCPC § VI.B.2.)

For option (c), the procedures specify that "[p]robable cause exists when based on the circumstances presented there is a reasonable basis on which to believe that a violation of the BERA has occurred." (*Id.* § VI.B.2.)

If the Commission finds probable cause that a violation has occurred, it "may take any of the following courses of action":

- a. Dismiss the complaint, where appropriate, and take no further action.
- b. Request the Secretary conduct further investigation, including an audit of campaign records;
- c. Require the timely filing of campaign statements and/or amendments to campaign statements if the probable violation involves an error and/or an omission on a campaign statement that has been filed, or if it involves the failure to file a campaign statement as required;
- d. Invite the respondents to participate in settlement negotiations. The Commission may request that the Secretary participate in negotiations on behalf of the Commission. Alternatively, the Chairperson may appoint a negotiating committee, which shall be guided by the Commission regarding the desired outcome of the settlement. Any settlement reached by the Secretary or negotiating committee and respondent(s) shall be presented to the commission for approval. Negotiations between the designated negotiator or negotiating committee and the respondent shall be confidential. Only the negotiated draft settlement agreement, or the fact of an impasse, shall be shared with the Commission.
- e. Schedule and conduct a hearing pursuant to Section 2.12.230 of BERA. The hearing shall be conducted in accordance with Part VII below after 12

> the Secretary has completed his or her report. However, the hearing must be conducted within a reasonable time after a determination of probable cause.

- f. Ask the City Attorney or the District Attorney to seek legal remedies.
- g. Seek any other remedy within its authority.

(Id. § VI.C.2.)

When deciding upon the appropriate action, the Commission may take into consideration the following factors:

- a. Its policies, procedures, regulations, and past actions in similar situations.
- b. The amount of experience of the candidate, if any, and treasurer in campaign reporting, the history or absence of other campaign violations, and the degree to which these persons made good faith efforts to correct any relevant reporting deficiencies.
- c. The presence, if any, of an apparent intent to conceal, deceive or mislead.
- d. Whether the probable violation appears deliberate, negligent or inadvertent.
- e. The effect of the probable violation upon the election or upon the administration of BERA.

(Id. § VI.C.1.)

IV. Staff Analysis and Recommendation

A. Prohibited Contributions

The complaint raises two related allegations relating to potential contributions from the City, in violation of BMC sections 2.12.445 and 2.12.500.A.7: (1) that the Committee used a City email distribution list for campaign purposes, and (2) that Committee staff used their City email accounts and City staff time to send campaign emails. The staff secretary's investigation has found no evidence to support either of these allegations.

City Email List. Because the City does not directly provide Councilmembers with email distribution lists, the question is whether City resources were used through Ms. Harrison's Council office to generate or maintain a campaign-related list, such that such a list could be considered a contribution from the City. The staff secretary has found no evidence of this. As indicated in the letters from Mr. Hendry (and verified in part by the Form 460 records), the campaign's email distribution list was hosted through an account with the Action Network paid for by the Committee in 2017 and 2018. In addition, according to Mr. Hendry, the account contains multiple email distribution lists that were

all generated using information supplied by Ms. Harrison herself, or collected by or paid for by the Committee, and not by the City.⁴

Emails from City Staff. The complaint also raised allegations that Ms. Harrison's Council staff sent campaign emails from a City email account, leading to prohibited contributions of City resources and staff time. The staff secretary has not found sufficient evidence to support these allegations.

The only evidence presented was the email newsletter sent by Mr. Rosen from his City email address. While having the same individuals serve as both campaign aides and City staff members creates the potential for campaigns to blur the lines between City and campaign activities, it is the staff secretary's conclusion that the email included in the complaint does not cross this line. While the campaign paid for the email to be sent, it was a garden-variety district newsletter that purported to inform constituents of ongoing policy issues in the City. It does not make any statements, for instance, "made directly or indirectly in aid of or in opposition to the nomination or election of one or more candidates." (BMC § 2.12.100 (definition of "contribution").) Nothing in the text of the message would indicate that Ms. Harrison was in midst of an election campaign, focusing instead on legislation, constituent concerns, and the profile of a local business. The only advocacy-related element of the email is the disclaimer at the end of the email stating that the Committee paid for the email. While this final line of the email could indicate the newsletter was sent in support of Ms. Harrison's candidacy, it is the staff secretary's conclusion that it should viewed within the overall context of a long, relatively neutral email sent four months before the election took place. (See, e.g., Vargas v. City of Salinas (2009) 46 Cal.4th 1, 38-39 [determining that a city council newsletter sent one month before election and describing the negative impacts of a proposed ballot measure was informational and not campaign activity, based on "the style, tenor, and timing"].)⁵

For these reasons, the staff secretary does not recommend the Commission find probable cause of a violation of BERA's contribution restrictions (BMC § 2.12.440 & 2.12.500.A.7).

⁴ It is unclear whether Ms. Harrison's Council staff, while acting in that capacity, have spent any time maintaining the lists. The staff secretary has no evidence that this has occurred, and the Action Network appears to be a full-service email platform that does not require a significant amount of manual maintenance of distribution lists.

⁵ The staff secretary notes that the Committee has stated that the FPPC disclaimer was inadvertently included in the newsletter. The staff secretary did not investigate whether other district newsletters sent by the Committee-supported email distribution list included a similar disclaimer, or when the Committee used the particular disclaimer that advises a recipient that she could unsubscribe from campaign emails but continue receiving newsletters. The question of whether an FPPC disclaimer would be required for any newsletters paid for by the Committee is beyond the scope of this staff report.

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B. Prohibited Use of Public Funds

While the Committee's email practices do not appear to violate BERA's contribution restrictions, the facts revealed in the course of the investigation do suggest a violation of the Fair Election Act's permissible uses of public campaign funds. (See BMC § 2.12.530.A.) The Committee's filed Form 460 records show consistent \$15 monthly payments to the Action Network during the period from January to December 2018, when Ms. Harrison received public funds. Mr. Hendry's communications with the staff secretary make clear that these expenditures were to pay for the monthly costs of one joint account used by Ms. Harrison for both direct campaign purposes (sending campaign emails) *and* unrelated officeholder purposes (sending district newsletters). Because public financing funds may be spent only for direct campaign purposes, these expenditures were improper, and the staff secretary recommends the Commission find probable cause of a violation.

If the Commission finds probable cause of a violation, it may choose to dismiss the complaint, request the staff secretary investigate further, invite the Committee to participate in settlement negotiations, or move to a hearing. (See Procedures for the FCPC, § VI.C.2.) It may also consider the penalty provisions applicable to Fair Elections Act violations outlined in section II.C of this report. In making this determination, the Commission may consider the factors outlined in section III of this report (e.g., the Commission's policies and past actions, the candidate's and the treasurer's experience, presence of the intent to conceal or to commit the violation, effect on the election, etc.).

Staff does not have a recommendation for how the Commission should proceed, if it chooses to find probable cause of a violation. The 2018 election cycle was the first time candidates—including incumbents, like Ms. Harrison, who had operated under past election rules and practices—were subject to the Fair Elections Act. In addition, the violation here appears to have been inadvertent, and the Committee has responded quickly to most of the staff secretary's questions, provided documentation of expenditures, and not shown any intent to mislead or conceal, either during the investigation or in its Form 460 filings. It also seems unlikely to the staff secretary that the expenditure of Fair Elections funds to pay for the Councilmember's district newsletters had a significant impact on the election, given the neutral tone of the one newsletter included in the complaint.

If the Commission chooses to invite the Committee and Ms. Harrison to participate in settlement negotiations, it could determine that a stipulation resolving the violation should include a requirement the Committee and Ms. Harrison cease paying for Ms. Harrison's district newsletter services. (BMC §§ 2.12.231.A [Commission can order party to cease and desist violation of BERA].) If the Commission determines that any such stipulation should include a penalty, it will need to consider whether the violation was committed willfully or knowingly. (See *supra*, § II.C; BMC §§ 2.12.231 [penalty for BERA violations of up to \$1,000 or value of unlawful expenditure, whichever is greater]; 2.12.460 [knowing and willful violations of BERA may lead to penalty of up to three

times value of violation]; 2.12.550.B-C [knowing and willful violation of Fair Elections Act spending provisions shall lead to repaying amount equal to twice value of violation, following hearing].) In this case, the Commission would also need to consider how to value the violation. The simplest way is to consider the full amount of the improper expenditures to the Action Network: \$15 per month for 12 months (\$180). This is the amount the Committee paid, according to Form 460 records, in monthly fees from the time Ms. Harrison received public funding in January 2018 to the final payment listed on the Committee's Form 460. By contrast, it would be more difficult (and require more information) to value the violation as the added cost, if any, for the Committee to pay only for the district newsletter distribution and maintenance.



Eliminating Vacant Units

UTILIZING OUR EXISTING HOUSING STOCK

Nearly 1,000 rent-controlled units sit vacant in the City of Berkeley each year; 440 of them are in rental properties that are entirely vacant and some of these buildings have sat empty for over 30 years. This adds to our housing scarcity and, in some cases, creates blight in our neighborhoods.

Legislation passed unanimously at the July 10 Council meeting marks a starting point in tackling this issue. I authored an amendment to the existing code that will categorize vacancy of more than 120 days (one year in case of inheritance) as a condition of blight. To be clear, two conditions are necessary to deem a property blighted; the legislation only adds long-term vacancy to the list of conditions. This modest legislation will provide a vehicle for the City to reach out to owners of long-term vacant, blighted rental stock.

Facilitating ADUs

BUILDING EFFICIENTLY



Every month, I write about the housing crisis facing our City. That's not a coincidence -- it is, easily, the most pressing issue facing our region. It's hard to find solutions to the crisis that consider the City's lack of land and the expense of constructing new housing units. Accessory Dwelling Units (ADUs), in this respect, fit the bill. They're resource-efficient, density-friendly and support multi-generational housing. Some experts project that we could build 4,000 ADUs in Berkeley if we eased regulations and, at the meeting on July 24, we will vote on more changes that will open the door for the construction of many more of these units in Berkeley. Some of the reforms include excluding ADUs from rent control to encourage their construction and allowing existing structures to be rebuilt in place to provide much-needed housing.

When the City wonders what can be done to chip away at an ostensibly intractable issue, paving the way for ADU construction must be one of the primary answers.

Pathways Success

HOUSING OUR HOMELESS



I'm extremely happy to report that the Pathways Project, a program dedicated to addressing homelessness in Berkeley, is already making a real impact. The STAIR Navigation Center, which opened just a couple of weeks ago, has filled all 45 of its beds with previously homeless residents of Berkeley.

Of course, the ultimate goal is not just to provide temporary housing solutions, but to provide a pathway toward permanent housing. To that end, the STAIR Center's seen two of its former residents already move out into permanent housing, with three more to follow next week. The program's outreach to encampments has become an extremely successful way to find clients interested in transitioning to permanent housing. It's gratifying to see our theoretical hopes of the potential of the Navigation Center fulfilled so swiftly, and gives me hope that we can use this model to continue to tackle homelessness, one project at a time.

Emergency Preparedness

PREPARING FOR THE WORST-CASE SCENARIOS

As it stands, only roughly half of City of Berkeley employees receive the necessary training to respond to emergency situations. At the July 24 meeting, the Council will consider a proposal authored by Councilmember Davila and I to train all remaining employees in emergency and disaster preparedness.

I believe this to be an urgent matter on which we need to take action. The state of California, more so than perhaps any other state, finds itself in the crosshairs of a potential catastrophe. Earthquakes, floods, and fires constantly threaten our way of being. We need every City employee to understand how to respond in these situations, because in the unlikely event of an emergency, every single one of us must harbor the potential to save a life as a first responder.

Helping Our Constituents

SERVING THE COMMUNITY

We receive dozens of phone calls a week from concerned constituents. Some can be dealt with on the phone, while others require more in-depth resolution. From March of 2017 to July of 2018, our office received more than 440 constituent complaints that required we intervene with the City bureaucracy. The most common of these contacts involved:

- Planning issues (75),
- Nuisances, health, trash or environmental concerns (65),
- · Infrastructure, parking or traffic (51),
- Police or safety (51),
- Housing (27), and
- Homelessness (20)

We spend a lot of time writing policy and solving bureaucratic issues, but the core of our work falls under the confines of good old customer service. I take pride in the fact that my office responds to each and every constituent request to the best of our ability.

Fiscal Responsibility

MANAGING OUR CITY FINANCES

Unfunded pension liabilities continue to be a pressing financial concern for local governments, draining resources from needed services and creating financial instability. On June 26, 2018, the Council tackled this issue proactively by establishing a trust fund to begin to combat unfunded pension liabilities. The trust will set aside funds to help pay down unfunded liabilities, prepare for and help cushion unexpected state (CALPERS) pension rate increases and market losses and improve the City's credit rating. Creating the trust is an alternative to sending the funds to CalPERS that allows for greater local control over the assets and investment portfolio management. Also, our investment returns are typically less volatile than those of CalPERS.

At the same time, the Council voted to continue increasing general reserve funds. We now have the largest reserve in the City's history, further cushioning us from likely future financial downturns. Earlier this year, we adopted strict policies limiting how and when reserve funds can be used. These actions, I believe, represent best practices in financial management.



Dear Ms. Soichet,

This note responds to allegations asserted in the above complaint.

As a threshold matter, the complaint is essentially hearsay, as the complainant alleges that another person or persons (unnamed) received a communication sent to an e-mail <u>allegedly</u> gathered from the city. However, as the name is deleted from these e-mails, we are unable to discern (given the multitude of potential sources) how this person received this e-mail. It is entirely possible that the recipient either voluntarily subscribed to our e-mail list, was forwarded it by someone else, or that his/her e-mail came from other non-City generated sources including electoral databases which provide candidates with voter-provided e-mails. Instead, the complaint alleges the use of a City financed e-mail distribution list, which, as also discussed below, does not exist. Accordingly, we are forced into trying to prove a negative. We believe this in and of itself renders the so-called evidence moot and the compliant without merit, as there is no evidence provided to support the allegations, and allegations do not rise to an actionable complaint. We ask that the matter be closed on this basis.

If you do decide to continue to pursue this complaint, we request that you defer consideration until we can provide you with a list of all of Councilmember Harrison's office expenditures since she took office. These will provide definitive proof that no City resources are used to support the mass email service account. We are requesting City of Berkeley staff to provide Ms. Harrison with this documentation, if necessary, to resolve this matter.

As a courtesy, we are also responding to the specific issues raised in the complaint.

The first part of the complaint alleges that Ms. Harrison used a city-generated or maintained email distribution list. The City of Berkeley does not provide lists to Councilmembers to communicate with constituents. Ms. Harrison has also never used City resources to pay to send emails.

As noted above, we are in the process of requesting the City of Berkeley prepare a listing of all of Councilmember Harrison's office expenditures since she took office to demonstrate conclusively that no public funds were used in mass email communications.

Ms. Harrison has generated her own mailing lists. Having lived in Berkeley for 42 years, Ms. Harrison has a wide acquaintance of neighbors and persons involved in City politics and had already acquired, well before running for the City Council the first time, an extensive e-mail list. This list has been supplemented by her recent campaigns. Sources include door to door canvassing, house parties, local

political clubs and organizations, and e-mail lists from Ms. Harrison's previous campaigns for City Council and the Alameda County Democratic Central Committee. As a candidate, Ms. Harrison is also provided with a list of emails from the PDI voter database (purchased with campaign funds) to use for campaign purposes. As a result, persons (such as the unnamed person cited in the complaint) could easily have been added to this e-mail list and received campaign emails by virtue of providing their e-mails to the Registrar of Voters, which supplies these lists to private database firms. If the un-named person or persons who received campaign emails did not sign up directly with the campaign, they likely received emails due to their inclusion on the Registrar list. This is a common confusion among voters, who may have provided an email many years ago to the Registrar, and even at that time may not have realized that campaigns are provided with those emails for use for political purposes.

Email communication platforms such as Action Network or Constant Contact (both used extensively by elected officials and campaigns) are required to have a standard footer associated with the account. That standard footer here is "Kate Harrison, Berkeley City Council." The standard footer on the account does not mean that it was an email paid for by the City, as implied in the complaint. In fact, the opposite is true. There have been no emails sent by Kate Harrison as a candidate or a Councilmember that has ever been paid for with City funds.

All of Ms. Harrison's city staff are part-time. Staff of elected officials often also commonly work, on their own-time, on the official's campaign. While working on Council business, they are paid with City funds. While working on campaign issues, they are paid from campaign funds (or volunteer their time). Mr. Rosen worked both in the office part time and under contract as a campaign staff person in his time away from City employment. We attach as Attachment 1 samples of his invoices as a campaign worker, the cancelled checks and corresponding reporting of those expenses. Mr. Rosen sent many emails in his capacity as a campaign employee. Those emails all reflect that they were properly sent from campaign@electkateharrison.com. In addition, they properly reflect that the content of the email was related to work being done regarding the campaign, and therefore they all properly have the footer "paid for by Kate Harrison for Berkeley City Council," with the associated FPPC number.

Mr. Rosen apparently made a mistake on one occasion when he was working in his capacity as a City employee after he had left the campaign by sending out an email that contained that same footer, "paid for by Kate Harrison for Berkeley City Council." Specifically, Mr. Rosen was sending an email to District 4 constituents from a different segmented email list kept on Action Network. This was a simple mistake and nothing more. Mr. Rosen's work on the office newsletter was a proper use of City resources, and is in the normal course of my office's Council work, before, during and after any election. His failure to remove the recital about campaigns was an innocent oversight that does not merit concern, and does not render the newsletter a campaign communication.

Throughout her career, Ms. Harrison has diligently sought the highest standards of integrity and transparency and is disappointed by this unfounded complaint. As discussed above, the complaint is

based on hearsay – from an unidentified individual or individuals. The complaint is entirely unsupported, and therefore it does not state an actionable matter. Finally, as the Commission's procedures note, in deciding if a complaint occurred, the FCPC may consider "the history or absence of other campaign violations" as well as "whether the probable violation was deliberate, negligent or inadvertent." Ms. Harrison's campaigns to date have received no violations and as discussed above the complaint raises no substantive issues.

Thank you for your consideration of this matter.

Dear Ms. Soichet,

This letter responds to your second request (on May 3, 2019), for additional information concerning your investigation into the alleged complaint. We believe, for the reasons set forth in our prior communications, that there is no probable cause or substance to this complaint and we reiterate our request, set forth in our May 2, 2019 letter, that the matter be closed. As we also stated in that letter, we will be able to provide definitive evidence to refute the alleged violation set forth in the complaint. Specifically, we have asked for the City's records showing all office expenditures made by Councilmember Harrison's office since her election in 2017, which will show that no City funds were ever used by Ms. Harrison's office to produce, maintain or distribute campaign email. In the meantime, we ask that you accept our word that this is the truth.

Unless there is a reason that you cannot accept our word with respect to the issue of Ms. Harrison's office expenditures, we do not believe a continuance is necessary. Instead, given that we have now had an extensive exchange of information — including the complete and comprehensive answers set forth below —we believe that you have enough information to immediately close this matter. If you do not agree, please provide a response to this letter that details why further review is necessary and in what ways our responses as set forth below and in our May 2, 2019 letter are not sufficient to make a "no probable cause" finding at this time, with sufficient time to allow us to review any response prior to any item being presented to the Commission.

To further assist you in making a "no probable cause" finding, our responses to your most recent (May 3) questions follow organized by the questions asked in your email.

1. Question: Your letter requests that the commission defer consideration of this complaint until you are able to provide documentation of all of Ms. Harrison's office expenditures, and states that you "are requesting City of Berkeley staff to provide Ms. Harrison" this documentation. To clarify, have you already made this request to City staff? If so, do you have an estimated date for when this information will be provided to the Commission?

Answer: We requested those documents immediately after you confirmed that you would be reviewing whether any actionable allegations had been raised. As you know, on the evening of April 25th, you indicated that there might *not* be an actionable complaint against the campaign. One day later (on April 26th), you then stated that you would investigate the complaint. Although a meeting with the campaign was planned for April 26, you asked to delay that meeting. Instead, you provided detailed questions for the campaign on April 30, 2019. We promptly reviewed those questions, compiled information immediately available to the campaign, and requested documentation from the City's

finance department regarding Ms. Harrison's City expenditures. Unfortunately, we cannot control how long the City might take to produce the requested account information, but we hope to have those documents very soon. That said, we believe you should rely on the truthfulness of our reply — that no City funds were used to send campaign emails and asked that you continue the hearing only if you felt that was not adequate. Please consider the supporting documents to be an extra formality.

2. <u>Question</u>: In your letter, you state that "no City resources are used to support the mass email service account," but it's unclear what account you are specifically referring to.

Answer: There is a single mass email account used by Kate Harrison. It is the ActionNetwork account. At no time has that account been paid using City funds.

3. <u>Question</u>: You also state that "no public funds were used in mass email communications." I want to make sure that I understand the scope of this response. My question was whether any City funds have been used to generate or maintain email distribution lists used by Ms. Harrison or to send mass emails on her behalf.

Answer: No City funds have been used to generate or maintain Kate Harrison's email distribution lists. Ms. Harrison, like all City Council members and the Mayor, composes newsletters using staff time. Some Councilmembers use their small City "supply" budgets to pay to maintain their email lists and/or distribute newsletters, but Councilmember Harrison does not. As stated above, Ms. Harrison has never spent any city or other public funds to pay for the email service she uses.

4. <u>Question</u>: Was your answer that no City funds have been used for any of these purposes, for any email distribution lists or communications? For instance, no City funds have ever been paid to the Action Network or similar platforms, or to purchase email lists.

Answer: Correct. Please see answer above.

5. <u>Question</u>: As a follow up, can you please confirm that that the Action Network is the only platform that Ms. Harrison has used for both district- and campaign-related email communications since she took office in 2017?

Answer: Yes.

6. Relatedly, I understand from your letter that communications to district constituents are sent from a "different segmented email list" on the Action Network than campaign emails. Does that mean that the email lists are part of the same account?

Answer: The email lists are segregated within one ActionNetwork account. There is no separate charge incurred under ActionNetwork for the use of segregated email lists. Ms. Harrison opened this ActionNetwork account when she first ran for office in 2016/2017. She paid for that account using campaign funds. She continued to pay for that account after she was elected using remaining campaign funds from the 2017 election, as fully allowed under campaign law before public financing was enacted. At that time, Ms. Harrison created a segregated email list in her ActionNetwork account. No additional ActionNetwork charge was incurred for the segregated email list.

When Ms. Harrison ran for re-election in 2018, she opted into public financing. She properly liquidated the remaining funds in the bank account and re-designated the 2016/2017 campaign committee and bank account for the 2018 campaign. As shown on the campaign disclosure forms, we paid for ActionNetwork using campaign funds. Because, as stated above, no separate charge was billed by ActionNetwork for the segregated email list, we had no charge to pass on to the City for sending out newsletters.

After Ms. Harrison was re-elected in 2018, she returned all unused campaign funds to the City of Berkeley. At that point, she began to pay for ActionNetwork using her own personal funds.

7. Question: Can you please verify the monthly costs for the platform's services for that account or, if the lists are held in separate accounts, for each account? I ask because the Form 460s on file for the Kate Harrison for City Council 2018 committee show payments to "Action Network" for "monthly fee[s]." If the campaign committee has paid for all of the email services since Ms. Harrison took office, this would be another way of demonstrating that the city did not contribute.

Answer: The monthly costs for the platform began at \$10/month and then increased to \$15 during the time Ms. Harrison used it for the campaign, as shown in the Form 460s as referenced in your question.

Following Ms. Harrison's return of all unused campaign funds from the 2018 campaign to the City of Berkeley, Ms. Harrison has paid for all emails she has sent from personal funds.

8. <u>Question</u>: How is/are the Action Network account/s (or the accounts related to any other email communication platforms Ms. Harrison uses) currently paid for?

Answer: They are not paid for with City or campaign funds. They are currently paid for from Ms. Harrison's personal funds.

Conclusion

Ms. Harrison has never used City resources to pay for a "mass email service" account — which is the question we understood to be at issue as an alleged violation under BERA. We expect to have the City's records to conclusively establish this fact shortly. Nonetheless, even without the definitive proof of the City's records, we feel compelled to emphasize that you have received the campaign's statement regarding this fact in writing numerous times, and for that reason, we reiterate our request that you dismiss this action.



Article 6. Limitations on Contributions

2.12.415 Persons other than candidate--Maximum permitted amount.

A. No person other than a candidate shall make and no campaign treasurer shall solicit or accept any contribution which will cause the total amount contributed by such person with respect to a single election in support of or in opposition to such candidate to exceed two hundred fifty dollars. For purposes of this section single election is a primary, general, special, runoff or recall election. (Ord. 5895 § 1, 1988: Ord. 4700-NS § 600, 1974)

- B. No person shall donate to more than 1 (one) candidate in any council district or for mayor in a single election. No candidate or campaign treasurer shall solicit or accept any contribution from a person who has contributed to another candidate in the same council district or for mayor in a single election. For purposes of this section, single election is a primary, general, special, runoff or recall election.
- C. A candidate choosing to participate in the Public Financing law shall make and no campaign treasurer shall solicit or accept any contribution of more than \$50.00. For purposes of this section single election is a primary, general, special, runoff or recall election.

Fair Campaign Practices Commission,

I think there is a glitch in Berkeley public campaign financing that is being exploited and which needs remedying after the election. In District 4 there are two candidates, who both represent the same developer interests and basically have many of the same endorsements. The candidates are running a tag-team - endorsing each other - while getting public financing. What this allows them to do is get twice the public financing giving them a 2-1 money advantage over their opponent. In fact, there is nothing to prevent a group of wealthy individuals from sponsoring 3 identical candidates, all crossendorsing each other resulting in a 3-1 money advantage over an opponent. If the opponent runs the same scam, then we break the public funding bank.

I think there are two parts to the solution. First, make it a stipulation of public financing not to endorse another candidate in your race. Second, make it so that donations don't get matching funds if they are given by a single donor who gives to two different candidates in the same race. Perhaps there are other needed changes to prevent this exploitation.

Perhaps there would be unforeseen consequences of these changes - but a discussion should be started, and changes made before the next election cycle.

To the members of the Fair Campaign Practices Commission:

2018 was the first election cycle in which candidates for Berkeley elected offices participated in the new Berkeley Fair Elections program. The Fair Elections program was adopted by voters who approved Measure X1 on the November 2016 ballot. The program provides candidates with 6-to-1 matching funds for candidates who agree to forego all contributions above \$50. The system was adopted with three goals in mind: (1) broadening the base of candidates who run for office, (2) encouraging grassroots and face-to-face connection with voters, and (3) limiting the influence of special-interest money on our local elections.

As the main proponents of this initiative, we as an organization reached out to the fourteen candidates for Berkeley city council to get their feedback on the program. Of these fourteen candidates, ten used public matching funds, while another two applied for public matching funds but were never qualified to receive funds. (More on that below.) We received responses from nine of the candidates.

Overall Satisfaction with the Program

Overall, the respondents had a positive view of the Berkeley Fair Elections program. This included progressives and moderates, incumbents and challengers, and winners and losers. In the 2018 race, every district was competitive, with at least one candidate besides the winner securing 30% of the vote. Four candidates maxed out on their matching contributions from the city, receiving \$40,000 from the city. Another candidate received just shy of the maximum, receiving \$39,450 from the city. The remaining participating candidates received between \$17,164 and \$30,269 in matching funds.

There were common responses from the candidates highlighting that the system performed as designed. Most candidates commented that the system allowed them to spend less time fundraising and more time engaging with voters. Many candidates also expressed the opinion that the low-contribution limit for matching funds (\$50 to receive \$300 in matching funds) encouraged them to engage with a broader segment of voters. Most candidates also expressed the view that the amount of the contribution limit (\$50) as well as the capped amount of public matching funds (\$40,000) was sufficient to run a credible campaign.

There were additional benefits from the system that we as proponents did not foresee — several candidates expressed the view that the public matching funds system allowed them to more easily plan and budget for their campaigns, knowing that they would likely max out on Berkeley's matching funds.

A few sample comments directly from candidates underscore the perceived benefits of the Fair Elections program. The sentiment of each of these comments represents a sentiment expressed by multiple other candidates as well.

In terms of impacting the election at large, I think public matching funds helped to encourage a more diverse group of candidates into the field- people that wouldn't have been able to personally contribute a lot to their campaigns were still able to run viable

campaigns because of the matching funds. This helped draw in people who worked full time, were students, or didn't have a ton of savings run for office.

-Candidate #1

It meant most fundraising happened as a part of other events, during canvassing, going to different political clubs. Definitely spent more time with voters that could only give \$5-10. I got donations from a couple people living in vans, students finding coins in their couch, etc. When deciding what events or organizations to go to, the number of people was a greater consideration than wealth of average membership.

-Candidate #2

I was able to gather funds earlier in the campaign, leaving me more time to speak with voters. It allowed me to more easily turn away funds from large organizations or requests from other candidates/organizations for contributions (I didn't have to say no; it is built in). It allowed more people to enter the race which made it more competitive.

-Candidate #3

Even a majority of the candidates who ultimately did not prevail had positive feedback about the program. Said one such candidate, "The 6 to 1 match got a lot of people excited as they were able to help the campaign significantly with even a couple of dollars." Said another such candidate, "[public matching funds] enabled me to reach out to a broader audience of potential and likely supporters, and provided a strong incentive for people to donate.... I was able to spend less time fundraising and more time focusing on talking to voters... I was running against an incumbent, and I think that public financing strongly helped to level the playing field and make it a much more competitive race." Another such candidate noted that they "absolutely support" public matching funds and expressed hope that "it can be expanded to other electoral office in the City."

The Financial Soundness of the Fair Elections Fund

The amount of mandatory monetary allocation by the City to the system appears to be sufficient to fund the program. Under the fair elections law, \$500,000 is contributed to a fair elections fund every year until the fund reaches \$2 million, at which point the fund is replenished up to the cap. According to the City Clerk, of the \$1 million allocated to the public financing program since 2016, the fair elections fund has a balance of \$580,645. After subtracting administrative costs, the fair elections fund will have \$1,466,121 to distribute for the 2020 elections, which will be more expensive than the 2018 race owing to the addition of the mayor's race. The fair elections fund appears to be solvent and working as designed.

Minor Reforms to Improve the Program

While most candidates expressed their overall support for the Fair Elections program, there were several areas that candidates identified as needing improvement. MapLight endorses three changes to the system in light of this feedback and MapLight's review of the system:

Speed Up Disbursements in August and September. One common concern was the pace of disbursements. Candidates most need funds in August and September, as campaign season ramps up and campaigns begin to prepare for the opening of vote-by-mail. For those candidates who do not get a jump on fundraising in spring or summer, the current disbursement schedule is insufficient. MapLight recommends amending the schedule to provide bi-monthly or weekly disbursements to candidates in this critical period to ensure that candidates have timely access to funds when needed most.

The City Clerk has suggested delegating approval requirements to the City, so that City Staff reviews and verifies a candidate's qualifying contributions. MapLight endorses this amendment, which would speed up the time between a candidate's submission of qualifying contributions and their approval to participate in the system. Having the City verify qualifying contributions, rather than the Commission, would transmit what is largely an administrative and ministerial function to city staff. MapLight understands that in the 2018 election cycle, the Commission followed all of the Staff's recommendations on qualifying contributions, suggesting that the process is already largely administrative and handled by City Staff.

Additionally, review by City Staff would facilitate more disbursements in the critical August/September periods as it would not require scheduling additional meetings of the Commission to approval candidate qualifications and disbursements.

Amend the Disqualification Rules. Several candidates expressed a desire to amend the law's strict disqualification rules. Two candidates were disqualified from receiving public funds owing to minor infractions (one candidate loaned his campaign \$100 prior to seeking public funds, rather than the statutory maximum \$50, and another candidate accepted an \$80 online contribution, which is above the \$50 limit.) Given the overall objective of encouraging more candidates to run for office — especially first-time candidates and political newcomers — MapLight believes the law should be amended to allow candidates to correct de minimis mistakes rather than face disqualification.

As one candidate expressed, "given how critical public financing is for many candidates, and how the intent of the system is to expand and democratize access to running, it seems like the penalties for minor errors should be re-evaluated, so that a small mistake would not completely dismantle a candidate's campaign overnight."

The system could also be amended to allow candidates to loan themselves and/or contribute to their own campaigns in an amount up to \$250 (the limit is currently \$50). This would give candidates quick access to a small amount of seed money for early campaign necessities, such as opening bank accounts (often banks require a minimum initial deposit of \$100), creating a small batch of campaign fliers, buying food for an initial campaign kickoff, and making copies of city forms for matching funds contributions.

Disclose Public Funds Received. As currently formatted, California Form 460, which is the form used for campaign contribution disclosures, does not show how much money in public matching funds a candidate has or has not received on the summary page. While an interested party can determine how much each candidate has received in matching funds, they must flip through multiple forms to verify a total amount received. To encourage transparency, MapLight suggests that the City Clerk publish a list of public funds disbursed to candidates at the close of each disclosure period on the City Website. In the long run, Form 460 should be amended to include a column for "public funds received" per period and cumulatively, but given that the is borrowed from the state this is impractical in the short term.

Overall, most candidates expressed the view that navigating the Fair Elections system was challenging. However, MapLight has no specific reforms to suggest in light of this common concern. Most candidates noted that the City Clerk's office was generous with its time and quick to respond to questions about the program. Given that the program is in its infancy, MapLight believes that in time candidates and treasurers will become more comfortable with the program.

Other Changes Suggested by Candidates

Other changes suggested by candidates, on which MapLight takes no position, include:

- Allowing candidates to loan their campaigns up to 50% of their expected initial disbursement to give them quick access to capital, rather than wait for disbursements from the City.
- Amending the law or regulations to clarify that payments for placement on a slate card do not count as "contributions" under the law and are thus a permissible use of public funds, even if the slate card is published by another committee.
 - Changing the donation rules to address these issues described by a candidate:
 - "The City also wouldn't accept two donations from the same credit card, even if it was a joint card. (They accepted joint checks that were signed by one of the two people on the account). This infuriated a lot of people who tried to donate but couldn't because Paypal (which we used as receipts for the donation) had only one of the couples' names registered. We also had a similar experience, where Paypal indicated that a person's account was tied to their individual business (usually self- employed consultants) and thus their forms were not accepted by the City because they appeared to come from businesses instead of individuals. I'd estimate we lost out on \$200 worth of donations because of these issues- people tried multiple ways of donating only to be told we couldn't accept their money."
- Amending the law to enable successful candidates to keep excess funds while they are in office.
 - "The issue successful candidates have is that they do not have a committee with political funds available to use during their term. Many electeds have websites or continue communicating with voters in a political way, outside of the parameters of their office, and use the committee and leftover campaign donations to do so. There is no accommodation for this under the current public financing system."
- Amending the law to allow for electronic signatures. Unlike traditional campaign contributions, contributions under the Fair Elections program must be accompanied by supporting paperwork. Amongst the required paperwork, each donation must be accompanied by a donor's signature verifying that the donor is a Berkeley resident. Modern campaigning, however, relies extensively on credit cards, online donations and remote contributions. In light of this reality, the signature requirement proved onerous to some candidates. Some candidates have suggested amending the signature requirement to enable electronic signatures. Maplight takes no position on the issue. While electronic signatures may make the system administratively easier

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for campaigns to run, the requirement of submitting an actual signature (or facsimile thereof) ensures that City money is not distributed without proper documentation.

MapLight looks forward to the FCPC's future consideration of amendments to the program and believes Berkeley can continue to lead the nation on this critical reform.

Dear Members of the FCPC,

Unfortunately I am unable to attend tonight's meeting. I'm in substantial agreement with the changes proposed by both MAPLight and city staff. Two suggestions that I didn't notice in the proposal are:

- (1) Considering a framework that ensures that contributions from Berkeley residents doing major business with the city are not matched. In the 2018 election, there were several instances of developers residing in Berkeley contribution only \$100 (between themselves and their spouse) to allow a candidate to receive a total of \$700. That seems to me to be counter to the concept of encouraging grassroots campaigning or reducing the influence of money in elections. I recognize that absent a lobbyist registration ordinance this may require some thinking as to Implementation. Nevertheless I wanted to flag that as a major issue that came up last year, which I do not see either proposal addressing as of yet.
- (2) There were credible claims made that in other districts (though not the one I ran in last year) some candidates used matching funds to coordinate their campaigns, such as through joint appearances on mailers or other literature. I believe this is supposed to be contrary to the spirit if not the letter of the ordinance. I suggest seeing if some clarity around either the language of the ordinance or around enforcement could be effected here.

SUBJECT: Officeholder Accounts

The purpose of this memo is to recommend amending BERA to prohibit Officeholder Accounts (Section 18531.62. Elected State Officeholder Bank Accounts, Regulations of the Fair Political Practices Commission) (Attachment 1) or, alternatively, amend BERA to mitigate unfair advantages incumbents have over challengers in terms of contributions to and expenses from an Officeholder Account fund.

Definition of an Officeholder Account: Funds in a single bank account at a financial institution in the State of California separate from any other bank account held by the officeholder to help pay for the cost of holding public office. Officeholder Account funds cannot be used to pay "campaign expenses." This definition is drawn from Section 18531.62 Elected State Officeholder Bank Accounts (Attachment 1).

Contributions to or expenditures from an Officeholder Account are not subject to BERA's reporting requirements. (The FPPC still requires the reporting of activity relating to an Officeholder Account.) If, however, a complaint is filed that an Officeholder Account is used for campaign contributions or to pay "campaign expenses," BERA can be used to respond to the complaint. The legal arguments for these statements are contained in a memo signed by City Attorney Manuela Albuquerque to Aide to Mayor Shirley Dean, Barbara Gilbert, dated December 28, 1999 (Attachment 2) and a memo referenced in the December 28, 1999 memo signed by Secretary and Staff Counsel to the FCPC, Sarah Reynoso, to the FCPC dated December 9, 1991 (Attachment 3).

Contributions to Officeholder Accounts

Funds raised for Officeholder Accounts are not subject to any limitations, either from the FPPC or BERA. Neither is the there a limit on the total amount the Officeholder Account fund may receive in contributions per year. Contributions to an elected official's Officeholder Account may put that contributor in a more favorable light with the elected official than might otherwise be the case.

Expenditures from Officeholder Accounts

BERA does not restrict how funds from Officeholder Accounts can be used. They cannot be used for "campaign expenses."

There are a number of permissible expenditures from Officeholder Accounts that could put the elected official in a favorable light that are not available to a challenger for that office. For example, a look at the Consent Calendar of City Council Meeting Agendas will contain one or more items from one or more Councilmembers making a donation to nonprofit organizations "from the discretionary council office budget" of the Councilmember. This is an account funded from the General Fund, which incidentally was increased from \$50,938 in FY 2017 to \$113,526 in FY 2018 (City of Berkeley Fiscal Years 2018 & 2019 Adopted Biennial Budget, Services and Materials, p. 200) (Attachment 4). The council office budget from which donations are being made is not the same as the Officeholder Account fund under discussion here, but serves as an example of the kind of expenditures that can be made from Officeholder Account funds that are not technically a "campaign expense," but certainly would be seen favorably by those receiving the funds as well as individuals favorably disposed to the nonprofit organization receiving the funds. A person running against this incumbent would have to draw on their own resources to match the contributions given in the name of an elected official.

As long as political campaigns are not included, newsletters mailed to constituents related to events, information, or an officeholder's position on matters before the Council are a permissible Officeholder Account expenditure. This keeps the incumbent's name in front of the voter in a way unavailable to a challenger unless they pay for a newsletter and its distribution from their own resources.

Expenditures from Officeholder Account funds for flowers and other expressions of condolences, congratulations, or appreciation, while technically not a "campaign expense" increases the probability that the recipient will be favorably predisposed toward the elected official and as a possible future candidate for reelection or election to another office. Again, a challenger would have to draw on their own resources to express condolences, congratulations, or appreciation to their constituents.

Recommendations

Prohibiting Officeholder Accounts seems to me to make the most sense. I believe only one Councilmember in Berkeley currently maintains an Officeholder Account, which therefore will require a grandfather clause in the ordinance. Berkeley will not be the first to prohibit Officeholder Accounts. The San Jose Municipal Code was amended to prohibit officeholder accounts in January 2008. (Chapter 12.05 – ELECTIONS, San Jose, CA Code of Ordinances, p. 10)

No city officeholder, or any person or committee on behalf of a city officeholder may establish an officeholder account or an account established

ISSUE:

Does the Berkeley Election Reform Act (BERA) govern officeholder accounts?

CONCLUSION:

No. The BERA does not govern true officeholder accounts per se. However, the mere fact that an account may be designated an officeholder account does not insulate it from scrutiny under the BERA or other applicable local law if the officeholder account is not used strictly for officeholder purposes or if some action taken with respect to the officeholder account implicates campaign contributions and expenditures or other applicable local laws.

ANALYSIS:

Sarah Reynoso, former secretary and staff counsel to the Pair Campaign Practices Commission (FCPC), issued an opinion to the FCPC dated December 2, 1991, a copy of which is attached, stating that the BERA's contribution limit does not apply to contributions made to an officeholder account. The opinion reasons that the BERA's contribution limit applies only to "contributions" as defined in the BERA, i.e., which are made directly or indirectly in support of or in opposition to the nomination or election of one or more candidates to elective office. (See Berkeley Municipal Code (BMC) § 2.12.100.) Contributions to a true officeholder account are not made for the purpose of nominating or electing a candidate to office, but rather for the use of an officeholder in carrying out the duties of his or her office. Therefore, the contribution limit of the BERA is inapplicable to officeholder accounts. For similar reasons, the BERA does not

¹ However, the opinion also provided that contributions to officeholder accounts still had to be reported on campaign statements because the State Fair Political Practices Commission (FPPC) Regulations broadly defined contributions as any contribution for "political purposes." apply to true officeholder accounts.

The BERA requires the filing of statements to report the amounts received and expended in municipal elections. (See BMC §§ 2.12.015, 2.12.030 through 2.12..050) Specifically, a "campaign statement" required to be filed under the BERA is an itemized report which provides the information required by Sections 2.12.245 through 2.12.325 of the BERA. (BMC § 2.12.080.) Sections 2.12.245 through 2.12.325 govern the reporting of contributions and expenditures. "Contributions" and "expenditures" are defined by the BERA as any amounts received or expended, respectively, in aide of or in opposition to the nomination or election of one or more candidates to elective office. (See BMC §§ 2.12.100 and 2.12.130.) Contributions to or expenditures from a true officeholder account are not subject to the BERA's reporting requirements because they are made for the purpose of carrying out the duties of elective office, and not for the purpose of aiding or opposing the nomination or election of one or more candidates to elective office. Therefore, the BERA does not apply to true officeholder accounts.

However, the fact that an account may be designated as an officeholder account will not shield it from scrutiny under the BERA if the officeholder account is, in fact, being used for the receipt of contributions or the making of expenditures in aide of the nomination or election of a candidate for local elective office. Nor will BERA requirements, such as the \$250 contribution limit or the prohibition against contributions from businesses to candidates, be held inapplicable if contributions made initially to an officeholder account are transferred subsequently to a campaign account. Where the actions taken with respect to an officeholder account implicate campaign contributions and expenditures in municipal elections, the officeholder account will be scrutinized under the BERA and other applicable local law.

SUBJECT: APPLICABILITY OF BERA'S CONTRIBUTION LIMIT TO FUNDS RAISED FOR OFFICEHOLDER EXPENSES

BACKGROUND AND ISSUE

I received the attached letter from Richard N. Lerner, treasurer of Friends of Loni Hancock Committee ("Committee"), regarding the applicability of BERA's (Berkeley Election Reform Act) \$250 contribution limit to funds raised to cover officeholder expenses. The Committee would like to raise money to cover activities by the Mayor for which the City has not allocated funds, for example, distribution of a newsletter and international travel to visit Berkeley Sister Cities.

Thus, the issue presented to the Commission is as follows: Is BERA's \$250 contribution limit applicable to funds raised for officeholder expenses?

CONCLUSION

No. The BERA's contribution limitation is only applicable to money raised "in aid of or in opposition to the nomination or election" of a candidate. Since the Committee intends to raise these funds for activities unrelated to the nomination or election of the Mayor, they are not subject to the BERA's \$250 contribution limitation. However, such funds must be reported as contributions under the State Political Reform Act and their expenditure itemized on the disclosure forms.

ANALYSIS

The BERA prohibits candidates for elective office from soliciting or accepting a contribution of more than \$250 from any one contributor. (BERA section 2.12.415.) Thus, funds which fall within BERA's definition of a contribution, are subject to the \$250 limit. In order to determine whether funds raised for officeholder expenses are subject to the contribution limitation, BERA's definition of contribution must be reviewed.

The BERA defines contribution, in part, as follows:

"Contribution" means a gift, subscription, loan, advance, deposit, pledge, forgiveness of indebtedness, payment of a debt by a third party, contract, agreement, or promise of money or anything of value or other obligation, whether or not legally enforceable, made directly or indirectly in aid of or

in opposition to the nomination or election of one or more candidates (Emphasis added.)

Thus, the plain language of the BERA requires that a contribution be solicited for purposes related to the nomination or election of a candidate for office to be subject to its contribution limitation. Since the Committee intends to raise funds for purposes unrelated to the Mayor's nomination or election for elective office, such funds do not fall within the BERA's definition and are therefore not subject to its \$250 limitation.

However, because the state Political Reform Act defines contribution to include any funds raised for political purposes, funds raised for officeholder expenses are considered contributions and must be reported on campaign disclosure forms. (Government Code section 82015.) Additionally, since the court's ruling in SEIU v. FPPC invalidated the state's \$1,000 contribution limit, funds raised for officeholder expenses are not subject to any limitation.

As a final precaution, the Committee should be advised that the FPPC has issued regulations concerning officeholder expenses and it should review them with respect to their interaction with the BERA.

3.12.150 - Officeholder fund.

- A. Every elected city officeholder shall be permitted to establish one officeholder expense fund. All contributions deposited into the officeholder expense fund shall be deemed to be held in trust for expenses associated with holding the office currently held by the elected city officer. Contributions to the officeholder fund must be made by a separate check or other separate written instrument. Single contributions may not be divided between the officeholder fund and any other candidate committee. For District Councilmembers, City Auditor and School Board Directors total contributions to an officeholder fund shall not exceed twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000.00) per year in office. For Councilmember-At-Large and City Attorney, total contributions to an officeholder fund shall not exceed thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000.00) per year in office. For the office of the Mayor, total contributions to an officeholder fund shall not exceed fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000.00) per year in office.
- B. Expenditures from an officeholder fund may be made for any political, governmental or other lawful purpose, but may not be used for any of the purposes prohibited in subsection (C)(1) through (5) of this section. Such allowable expenditures shall include, but are not limited to the following categories:
 - 1. Expenditures for fundraising (including solicitations by mail) for the officeholder expense fund;
 - 2. Expenditures for office equipment, furnishings and office supplies;
 - Expenditures for office rent;
 - 4. Expenditures for salaries of part-time or full-time staff employed by the officeholder for officeholder activities;
 - 5. Expenditures for consulting, research, polling, photographic or similar services except for campaign expenditures for any city, county, regional, state or federal elective office;
 - 6. Expenditures for conferences, meetings, receptions, and events attended in the performance of government duties by (1) the officeholder (2) a member of the officeholder's staff; or (3) such other person designated by the officeholder who is authorized to perform such government duties;
 - 7. Expenditures for travel, including lodging, meals and other related disbursements, incurred in the performance of governmental duties by (1) the officeholder, (2) a member of the officeholder's staff, (3) such other person designated by the officeholder who is authorized to perform such government duties, or a member of such person's household accompanying the person on such travel;
 - 8. Expenditures for meals and entertainment directly preceding, during or following a governmental or legislative activity;
 - 9. Expenditures for donations to tax-exempt educational institutions or tax exempt charitable, civic or service organizations, including the purchase of tickets to charitable or civic events, where no substantial part of the proceeds will have a material financial effect on the elected officer, any member of his or her immediate family, or his or her committee treasurer;

 - 3. Membership in any athletic, social, fraternal, veteran or religious organization;
 - Supplemental compensation for employees for performance of an act which would be required or expected of the person in the regular course or hours of his or her duties as a city official or employee;
 - 5. Any expenditure that would violate the provisions the California State Political Reform Act, including Government Code Sections 89506 and 89512 through 89519.
- D. No funds may be transferred from the officeholder fund of an elected city officeholder to any other candidate committee.
- E. Annual contributions received by or made to the officeholder fund shall be subject to the contribution limitations of Article III of this Act.
- F. Expenditures made from the officeholder fund shall not be subject to the voluntary expenditure ceilings of Article IV of this Act.
