

Subject: City Clerk Department referral to Commission regarding failure

of Mike Chang for Berkeley School Board 2022 to file campaign

report covering Oct. 23, 2022 to Dec. 31, 2022

At its April 20, 2023 meeting, the Commission received the attached referral from the City Clerk Department regarding apparent failure by the campaign committee Mike Chang for Berkeley School Board 2022 (the "Campaign") to file its Campaign Statement (Form 460) covering the period from October 23, 2022 to December 31, 2022. (See Attachment 2, Secretary's May 3, 2023 Letter to Campaign, including attached Clerk referral.) The Campaign Statement, which covers the Campaign's activity immediately preceding and following the November 2022 Election, was due January 31, 2023.

Following discussion at its April meeting, the Commission moved to direct staff to send a letter informing the Campaign that the Commission had received the referral and that continued failure to file the outstanding report would result in enforcement action by the Commission. The Commission Secretary sent the attached letter to the Campaign on May 3, 2023 and provided the Commission with a copy of the letter in the packet for its May 18, 2023 meeting. (See Attachment 2.)

At its May 18, 2023 meeting, the Commission voted to direct the Secretary to return with a report making a recommendation regarding whether the Commission should make a finding of probable cause that the Campaign has violated the Berkeley Election Reform Act ("BERA") (BMC Ch. 2.12.). In response to that direction from the Commission, this Staff Report is submitted pursuant to the Commission's Procedures section VI.A.1, which provides that "[t]he Secretary shall submit a memorandum outlining the Secretary's investigation before any probable cause determination . . ."

BERA requires that City campaign committees file campaign reports consistent with the requirements of state law. (See BMC §§ 2.12.032.A & 2.12.270.A.) The provision of state law incorporated by reference requires that candidates and committees "shall file semiannual statements each year no later than July 31 for the period ending June 30, and not later than January 31 for the period ending December 31." (Cal. Gov. Code § 84200(a).) The Campaign was therefore required to file a Campaign Statement by January 31 covering the period ending on December 31, 2022.

Page 2 Re: Mike Chang for Berkeley School Board 2022

Following receipt of the Clerk's referral, the Secretary confirmed that the City did not possess any record of the Campaign filing the Campaign Statement covering the period from October 23, 2022 to December 31, 2022, which was due on January 31, 2023. The City Clerk Department had sent the Campaign six notices informing the Campaign of its obligation to file this Campaign Statement. Additionally, at the direction of the Commission, the Secretary sent a letter to the Campaign on May 3, 2023, again notifying the Campaign of its obligation to file the outstanding Campaign Statement.

On May 19, 2023, the Campaign filed the outstanding Campaign Statement covering the period from October 23, 2022 to December 31, 2022. The Campaign Statement was due on January 31, 2023. The Campaign Statement was therefore filed one hundred eight (108) days late.

As indicated in the attached report from the City Clerk, the Campaign was notified on July 28, 2023, of items appearing noncompliant with BERA in the filed statement. (Attachment 1.) These included nondisclosure of \$15,930 in Public Matching Funds disbursed to the committee by the City, apparent failure to return all unspent funds no later than January 7, 2023 per BERA Section 2.12.505.H (the statement showed an ending cash balance of \$1,364.44), and potentially improper reporting of payments made and accrued expenses totaling \$13,127.31. On September 12, 2023, the candidate met with City Clerk Department staff to review the NetFile procedures and file amendments to three of the Campaign's statements, including the statement covering the period from October 23, 2022 to December 31, 2022. (Attachment 1.)

As the attached report from the City Clerk indicates, on September 12, 2023, the Campaign also filed the semi-annual campaign statement for the period from January 1, 2023 to June 30, 2023. This statement was due on July 31, 2023.

Despite the amendments and subsequent semi-annual report filed by the Committee, a number of discrepancies remain in the Campaign's reports. For example, as discussed in the attached City Clerk report, the most recent report filed shows a negative cash balance of \$2,292. (Attachment 1 & Attachment 3.) This negative cash balance is indicative of a number of potential errors in the Campaign's reports. For instance, the negative balance could indicate errors in how the Campaign's expenditures or contributions were reported.

The City Clerk has independent authority under state law to issue late filing penalties for campaign committees that file untimely reports. (Cal. Gov. Code § 91013(a) ("If any person files an original statement or report after any deadline imposed by this act, the person shall, in addition to any other penalties or remedies established by this act, be liable in the amount of ten dollars (\$10) per day after the deadline until the statement or report is filed, to the officer with whom the statement or report is required to be filed.").)

The attached report from the City Clerk outlines the late penalty notices which have been issued to the Committee as well as potential late penalty amounts for late filings received in 2023, totaling \$1,660. (Attachment 1.) As the Clerk's report indicates, the Clerk intends to issue these additional fines if the Commission takes no further action.

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Pursuant to section VI.A.2 of the Commission's Procedures, the Secretary shall provide "an analysis of the harm done by the alleged violation." Although failure by campaigns to timely file Campaign Statements is not uncommon, the harm caused in this case by the Campaign's failure to file is significant. First, the late-filed Campaign Statement for October 23, 2022 to December 31, 2022 covers the period immediately preceding and following the November 8, 2022 Election. As a result, the public was denied important information about the Campaign's fundraising and expenditures during what is often the most active period of the campaign cycle. Second, the Campaign Statement was unfiled for one hundred eight (108) days from its due date. This represents a significant period in which important campaign finance information has been withheld from the public. Third, the Campaign was the recipient of \$15,930 of public matching funds as a participant in the City's Public Financing Program. The public arguably has an even greater interest in disclosure of campaign activities where a campaign receives and spends public money.

However, although the significant lateness and continued inaccuracy of the Campaign's reports raises significant issues regarding public access to important campaign financing information, the Commission Secretary is mindful that the campaign reporting process is complex and presents many challenges to candidates and campaigns. As a result, the Secretary recommends that the Commission consider its desire for enforcement along with the practical task of bringing the Campaign into compliance with BERA so that the public may have access to all the information to which it is entitled.

Recommendation

After receiving this report from the Secretary, the Commission may take either of the following actions:

- Dismiss the matter (by majority vote) and proceed no further if evidence of any violation is insufficient or unreliable or if the possible violation has only a slight impact on the administration of BERA and/or the outcome of any election that further proceeding would be an inefficient use of resources.
- 2. Determine that probable cause exists to believe that the BERA has been violated.

(FCPC Procedures § VI.B.)

As outlined below, the Secretary recommends that the Commission (1) make a finding of probable cause that a violation of BERA has occurred, and (2) empanel a subcommittee which can invite the Campaign to participate in settlement negotiations and work collaboratively with the Campaign to bring its reports into compliance with BERA.

Specifically, the Secretary recommends the Commission find that probable cause exists to believe the following violations have occurred:

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1. Failure to timely file the semi-annual campaign statement covering the period from October 23, 2022 to November 31, 2022. (BMC § 2.12.270.)

- 2. Failure to timely file the semi-annual campaign statement covering the period from January 1, 2023 to June 30, 2023. (BMC § 2.12.270.)
- 3. Failure to accurately report contributions or expenditures as evidenced by the \$2,292 negative cash balance reported in the Campaign's most recent statement. (BMC § 2.12.280.)

Pursuant to the Commission's Procedures, "Probable cause exists when based on the circumstances presented there is a reasonable basis on which to believe that a violation of the BERA has occurred." (FCPC Procedures § VI.B.2.) As outlined in the foregoing report, there is substantial evidence that the Campaign failed to timely file a required Campaign Statement and that the Campaign's filings continue to misreport contributions and/or expenditures. Note that a finding of probable cause is <u>not</u> a finding that a violation of BERA has actually occurred.

If the Commission accepts the Secretary's recommendation and makes a finding of probable cause, the Commission may take any of the following courses of action:

- a. Dismiss the complaint, where appropriate, and take no further action.
- b. Request the Secretary conduct further investigation, including an audit of campaign records;
- c. Require the timely filing of campaign statements and/or amendments to campaign statements;
- d. Invite the respondent Campaign to participate in settlement negotiations.
- e. Schedule and conduct a hearing pursuant to Section 2.12.230 of BERA.¹

After the commission determines there is probable cause for believing that a provision of this chapter has been violated and makes a good faith effort to give reasonable notice to the person or persons involved in the allegation, it may hold a hearing to determine if a violation has occurred, and may determine an appropriate remedy if a violation is found. The hearing pursuant to this section shall be conducted in an impartial manner, consistent with the requirements of due process. A record shall be maintained of the proceedings, and a report summarizing the facts, issues, and any remedial actions shall be issued by the commission following the conclusion of the hearing.

The commission shall conduct such hearings and proceedings with respect to determinations of probable cause pursuant to adopted procedures. All interested persons may participate in the hearing.

¹ BMC § 2.12.230:

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f. Ask the City Attorney or the District Attorney to seek legal remedies.

g. Seek any other remedy within its authority.²

Under the Commission's Procedures, the Commission may request that the Secretary participate in negotiations on behalf of the Commission. Alternatively, the Chair may appoint a negotiating subcommittee "which shall be guided by the Commission regarding the desired outcome of the settlement." (FCPC Procedures § VI.C.2.d.)

Settlement negotiations must adhere to the following procedures:

- 1. Negotiations between the Secretary or subcommittee and the respondent are confidential.
- 2. Any settlement reached by the Secretary or subcommittee must be presented to the Commission for approval.
- 3. The Secretary or subcommittee will only share a negotiated draft settlement agreement, or the fact of an impasse, with the full Commission.

(FCPC Procedures § VI.C.2.d.)

The Secretary recommends that the Commission empanel a negotiation subcommittee with the power to engage in settlement negotiations with the Campaign. As noted above, the Campaign's filings continue to have a variety of discrepancies and apparent inaccuracies. The goal of such a subcommittee would be to obtain compliance by the Campaign through the filing of amendments and reach an agreed upon monetary penalty. The subcommittee should be mindful that the City Clerk has independent authority to issue fines of \$1,660, but has refrained from issuing these fines pending action by the Commission.

If a settlement cannot be reached, the Commission could then move to a hearing, after which the Commission would make a determination regarding whether a violation of BERA has occurred.

² The Commission's Procedures provide that "[w]hen deciding upon appropriate action, the Commission may take into consideration: (a.) Its policies, procedures, regulations, and past actions in similar situations. (b.) The amount of experience of the candidate, if any, and treasurer in campaign reporting, the history or absence of other campaign violations, and the degree to which these persons made good faith efforts to correct any relevant reporting deficiencies. (c.) The presence, if any, of an apparent intent to conceal, deceive or mislead. (d.) Whether the probable violation appears deliberate, negligent or inadvertent. (e.) The effect of the probable violation upon the election or upon the administration of BERA." (FCPC Procedures § VI.C.1.)

This memo details the summary of issues, fines, and referral for enforcement previously brought to the Fair Campaign Practices Commission for the *Mike Chang for Berkeley School Board 2022* campaign committee. Copies of supporting documentation are attached.

Summary of issues

On March 28, 2023, the committee was referred to the Fair Campaign Practices Commission for enforcement for non-filing of the required semi-annual Form 460 due on January 31, 2023 covering the period of October 23 – December 31, 2022. The referral included additional information regarding unpaid late penalties levied against the committee for failure to timely file two previous campaign reports.

The first unpaid fine is for the semi-annual report covering the period of July 1 – December 31, 2021 due on January 31, 2022 and filed ten (10) days late. This report is for Mr. Chang's 2020 campaign committee. The second unpaid fine is for the pre-election report covering the period of September 25 – October 22, 2022 due on October 27, 2022 and filed five (5) days late.

Government Code Section 91013 imposes a fine of \$10 per day after the filing deadline until the statement is filed. Notices of penalties for the previously issued fines were sent on February 17, 2022 and November 7, 2022. The \$100 and \$50 fines remain unpaid.

On May 19, 2023, the committee filed the required semi-annual Form 460 due on January 31, 2023 covering the period of October 23 – December 31, 2022 one-hundred and eight (108) days late and it is subject to the \$10 per day late filing penalty prescribed in the California Political Reform Act. The statement is eligible for a \$1,080 fine.

On July 28, 2023, the committee was notified of items appearing noncompliant with BERA in the filed statement such as nondisclosure of \$15,930 in Public Matching Funds

disbursed to the committee by the City, failure to return all unspent funds no later than January 7, 2023 per BERA Section 2.12.505.H (the statement showed an ending cash balance of \$1,364.44), and potentially improper reporting of payments made and accrued expenses totaling \$13,127.31.

On September 12, 2023, staff provided assistance to Assistant Treasurer/Candidate Mike Chang regarding the proper method to enter transactions in the NetFile system. On the same day, the committee filed amendments for the following:

Pre-election statement for the period of 7/1/2022-9/24/2022 (Amendment #2) Pre-election statement for the period of 9/25/2022-10/22/2022 (Amendment #2) Semi-annual statement for the period of 10/23/2022-12/31/2022 (Amendment #1)

On September 12, the committee also filed the semi-annual statement for the period of January 1 – June 30, 2023. This statement was filed forty-three (43) days late and is subject to the \$10 per day late filing penalty prescribed in the California Political Reform Act. The statement is eligible for a \$430 fine.

On September 20, 2023, the committee was notified on items appearing noncompliant with BERA for the statements filed on September 12, 2023. The most recent statement has an ending cash balance of *negative* \$2,292. The negative cash balance of \$2,292 in the committee's semi-annual indicates that there are potential errors in how the committee's transactions were entered, the committee's bank account is overdrawn, or that there is unreported money received by the committee. Non-disclosure of contributions is a violation of BERA and is subject to a monetary penalty of up to \$1,000 as described in BMC section 2.12.231.

On September 27, 2023 staff provided additional NetFile assistance to Assistant Treasurer/Candidate Mike Chang. The filer has not rectified the negative balance discrepancy as of October 6, 2023.



Please be informed that the City of Berkeley's Fair Campaign Practices Commission ("FCPC" or "Commission") considered the attached referral ("Referral") from the City Clerk Department at its meeting on Thursday, April 20, 2023. As indicated in the Referral, your campaign committee has failed to file the following:

 Campaign Statement (Form 460) for the period October 23, 2022 to December 31, 2022, due January 31, 2023

As the Clerk's Referral indicates, you have received six separate notices reminding you of your obligation to file the above campaign statement. Continued failure to file any outstanding campaign statements may result in enforcement action by the FCPC.

Pursuant to the Berkeley Election Reform Act ("BERA"), the FCPC is empowered to levy fines of up to \$1,000 per violation, or up to the amount of the undisclosed contributions or expenditures, whichever is greater. (BMC § 2.12.231.C.) Additionally, should the Commission determine that a candidate has committed a "substantial violation" of BERA, the candidate will be barred from receiving matching funds under the City's public financing program for a period of four years. (BMC § 2.12.555.)

At its April 20, 2023, meeting, the Commission noted that failure to file this campaign statement in particular deprives the public of important campaign finance information as this statement covers contributions and expenditures for the period immediately preceding and following the 2022 election.





Subject: BERA Clean-up amendment to ensure consistency with

contribution limit cost of living adjustment

City staff have drafted a set of proposed technical amendments to the Berkeley Election Reform Act (BERA) to amend sections of BERA which have been affected by the 2021 adoption of a cost of living adjustment for the candidate contribution limit and subsequent amendments. (See BMC § 2.12.415.)

First, the proposed amendments address sections of BERA which use the now-obsolete \$250 amount to set thresholds for filing and disclaimer requirements. (See Attachment 1.) The \$250 threshold was presumably adopted in these contexts to parallel the candidate contribution limit. Now that the candidate contribution limit changes with cost of living, and is currently set at \$270, staff recommends that these other thresholds be amended so that they will similarly change as cost of living adjustments are made to the candidate contribution limit.

Second, the proposed amendments provide changes to provisions related filing requirements in order to parallel the new threshold for qualification as a "committee," which was increased from \$250 to \$1,000 following adoption of the cost of living adjustment for the candidate contribution limit.

These amendments were first presented to the Commission at its September 21, 2023 meeting. At that meeting, the Commission noted a concern about the proposal's adjustment of the \$250 limits in Section 2.12.271 and 2.12.335 to \$270. The Commission discussed how increasing the dollar amounts in the body of BERA would cause the amounts to increase in a manner inconsistent with the rest of the adjusted amounts in BERA. Staff have revised the proposed amendment to provide for an initial adjustment of the \$250 amounts Section 2.12.271 and 2.12.335 so that these amounts may "catch up" to other adjustable amounts in BERA and thereafter be increased in January of each odd-numbered year consistent with all other BERA cost of living adjustments. This change is reflected with a new proposed Section 2.12.545.B.

Pursuant to Berkeley Municipal Code Section 2.12.051, BERA may be amended by the "double green light" process. This process requires that the FCPC adopt the amendments by a two-thirds vote, and the City Council hold a public hearing and adopt the amendments by a two-thirds vote.

Staff believes these technical amendments ensure consistency between BERA's interrelated provisions and therefore recommends that the Commission approve the attached amendments by a two-thirds vote for submission to the City Council.

With the recent adoption of technical amendments to BERA in June of 2023, other cross-referenced or related sections were discovered and must now be amended for consistency.

The original set of clean up amendments was presented to the FCPC on September 21, 2023. At the meeting is was discovered that the proposed amendments would results in an offset in the dollar amounts due to the formula used for the CPI inflator.

Staff is proposing a new path for the amendments to achieve consistency with all former \$250 limits/thresholds as they are adjusted every two years.

Amendment #1

Section 2.12.545 Cost of living adjustments

Section 2.12.271 Campaign statements--Additional filing requirements

Section 2.12.335 Disclosure on campaign communications of certain contributions and loans

Both Section 2.12.271 and Section 2.12.335 have dollar amount thresholds that are related to the now-obsolete \$250 contribution limit. As you know, the \$250 limit was indexed up to \$270 earlier this year.

These two sections have been added to the list of dollar amounts that are indexed contained in Section 2.12.545. Section 2.12.545 requires that the amounts are adjusted in January of odd-numbered years. In order for the amounts in 2.12.271 and 2.12.335 to "catch-up" to the previously indexed amounts, language has been added to provide for the amounts in these sections to be adjusted immediately after the clean-up amendments have been adopted.

Section 2.12.271 adds additional filing requirements for committees that make contributions for or against ballot measures. The quarterly filing requirement in this section is for committees that make expenditures in excess of \$250 in support of or in opposition to a city ballot measure. In order to keep this threshold tied to the contribution limit.

Section 2.12.335 requires the listing of the top-four contributors under "Major Funding Provided By" on certain campaign materials. The threshold for the top-four was established at "over \$250" so that it only captured contributions that exceeded the individual person limit of \$250.

2.12.545 Cost of living adjustments.

A) The Commission shall adjust the dollar amounts specified in Sections 2.12.167, 2.12.271, 2.12.335, 2.12.500.A.3, 2.12.500.A.6, 2.12.500.A.7, 2.12.500.A.8, 2.12.505.B. and 2.12.530.B.3.b for cost of living changes pursuant to Section 2.12.075 in January of every odd-numbered year following Council implementation. Such adjustments shall be

rounded to the nearest ten dollars (\$10) with respect to Sections 2.12.167, 2.12.500.A.3 and 2.12.530.B.3.b and one thousand dollars (\$1,000) with respect to Section 2.12.505.B.

B) As soon as practicable after adoption of the amendments providing for the adjustment of Sections 2.12.271 and 2.12.335, but no later than December 31, 2024, the Commission shall perform an initial adjustment of the dollar amounts in those sections.

Amendment #2

The definition of a campaign committee was changed from a \$250 threshold to a \$1,000 threshold in Section 2.12.095. The related change to Section 2.12.270 reflects this update, but uses a cross-reference to Section 2.12.095 in order to keep the language relevant and current even if future amendments are adopted. Also, staff recommends deleting the use of "telegram" as a communication method to help modernize the code.

2.12.270 Campaign statement--Filing requirements.

- A. Each candidate and each committee shall file no fewer than two campaign statements prior to an election, excluding run-off elections, and one campaign statement following the election, excluding run-off elections. Campaign statements shall be filed in accordance with the filing dates prescribed by state law. The semi-annual campaign statement that is filed pursuant to state law following an election shall serve as the post-campaign statement required by this section. If state law does not establish the filing dates for campaign statements, the commission shall set the necessary filing dates.
- B. Each candidate and committee involved in a run-off election, and each committee supporting or opposing a candidate participating in a run-off election, shall file one campaign statement prior to the run-off election in addition to any other campaign statements required by this section and one campaign statement following the run-off election. The semi-annual statement that is filed pursuant to state law following a run-off election shall serve as the post-campaign statement required by this section. The campaign statements shall be filed in accordance with the filing dates prescribed by state law. If state law does not establish the filing dates for campaign statements in run-off elections, the commission shall set the necessary filing dates.
- C. 1. Notwithstanding subsections A and B of this section, a candidate or officeholder who plans to receive contributions or make expenditures of less than the committee threshold in Section 2.12.095 two hundred fifty dollars and who plans to make expenditures of less than two hundred fifty dollars in a calendar year may file a short form campaign statement for that calendar year as prescribed by state laws and regulations. The period covered by the short form is the calendar year. If No other campaign statements must be filed by athe candidate or officeholder who has filed a short form campaign statement for activity in the calendar year unless the candidate

<u>makesreceives two hundred fifty dollars or more in expenditures or receives</u> contributions that exceed the committee threshold in Section 2.12.095, they must file campaign statements as required by subsections A or B, or other applicable sections of Chapter 2.12.

- 2. During the six months prior to an election in which the candidate or officeholder is being voted upon, a candidate or officeholder who files a short form campaign statement and subsequently receives contributions or makes expenditures exceeding the committee threshold in Section 2.12.095 totaling two hundred fifty dollars or more or makes expenditures totaling two hundred fifty dollars or more during the calendar year shall send written notification to the City Clerk, and each candidate or officeholder contending for the same office, as follows:
- (a) The notification shall be sent within forty-eight hours of receiving contributions or making expenditures-exceeding the committee threshold in Section 2.12.095 totaling two hundred fifty dollars or more or making expenditures of two hundred fifty dollars or more;
- (b) The notification shall include the name and address of the candidate or officeholder, the elective office for which the short form campaign statement was filed, the date of the election, and the date contributions exceeding the committee threshold in Section 2.12.095 totaling two hundred fifty dollars or more were received or expenditures exceeding the committee threshold in Section 2.12.095 totaling two hundred fifty dollars or more were made;
- (c) The notification shall be sent by telegram, guaranteed overnight delivery, personal delivery, or facsimile transmission.

With the recent adoption of technical amendments to BERA in June of 2023, other cross-referenced or related sections have been identified which staff recommend be amended for consistency. The proposed text of the amendments and a narrative description is provided below.

Amendment #1

Section 2.12.545 Cost of living adjustments

Section 2.12.271 Campaign statements--Additional filing requirements

Section 2.12.335 Disclosure on campaign communications of certain contributions and loans

Both Section 2.12.271 and Section 2.12.335 have dollar amount thresholds that are related to the now-obsolete \$250 contribution limit. As you know, the \$250 limit is now indexed every two years and is currently set at \$270.

Section 2.12.271 adds additional filing requirements for committees that make contributions for or against ballot measures. The quarterly filing requirement in this section is for committees that make expenditures in excess of \$250 in support of or in opposition to a city ballot measure. In order to keep this threshold tied to the contribution limit, this amendment sets the threshold at \$270 in Section 2.12.271 and adds it to the list of dollar amounts that are adjusted every two years per Section 2.12.545.

Section 2.12.335 requires the listing of the top-four contributors under "Major Funding Provided By" on certain campaign materials. The threshold for the top-four was established at "over \$250" so that it only captured contributions that exceeded the individual person limit of \$250. Similar to the amendment described above, in order to keep this threshold tied to the contribution limit, this amendment sets the threshold at \$270 in Section 2.12.335 and adds it to the list of dollar amounts that are adjusted every two years per Section 2.12.545.

2.12.545 Cost of living adjustments.

The Commission shall adjust the dollar amounts specified in Sections 2.12.167, 2.12.271, 2.12.335, 2.12.500.A.3, 2.12.500.A.6, 2.12.500.A.7, 2.12.500.A.8, 2.12.505.B, and 2.12.530.B.3.b for cost of living changes pursuant to Section 2.12.075 in January of every odd-numbered year following Council implementation. Such adjustments shall be rounded to the nearest ten dollars (\$10) with respect to Sections 2.12.167, 2.12.500.A.3 and 2.12.530.B.3.b and one thousand dollars (\$1,000) with respect to Section 2.12.505.B.

2.12.271 Campaign statements--Additional filing requirements.

A. Each committee that makes expenditures in excess of \$270250 in support of or in opposition to a measure must, in addition to campaign statements required by Section 2.12.270 of this Chapter, file campaign statements on the following dates: (1) no later

than April 30 for the period January 1 through March 31; and (2) no later than October 31 for the period July 1 through September 30. If the committee has earlier pre-election statement filing deadlines, the earlier deadlines apply.

B. Any additional filing requirement under this section shall cease upon the occurrence of any of the following dates, whichever occurs first: (1) the election day on which the measure is voted upon, (2) six months after the measure fails to qualify for the ballot, (3) six months after an ordinance subject to referendum is repealed by the City Council, or (4) six months after an elected official subject to recall resigns or otherwise leaves office.

2.12.335 Disclosure on campaign communications of certain contributions and loans.

- A. Campaign communications supporting or opposing any candidate or measure shall include the name of the committee and the phrase "Major Funding Provided By" immediately followed by the name of the contributor, the city of domicile, and the total cumulative sum of contributions by each of the top four contributors over \$270250 to the committee funding the expenditure made within six months of the expenditure. For purposes of this section, the term "contributor" shall include lender, and committees shall aggregate contributions and any loan balances from the same person when determining the total cumulative sum of contributions from a contributor.
- B. The disclosures required by this section shall list contributors in descending order by the cumulative total amount of their contributions and shall be presented in a clear and conspicuous manner to give the reader, observer, or listener adequate notice. For all communications, the complete name of the contributor must be listed. No acronyms may be used. For purposes of this section, "campaign communication" means any of the following items:
- 1. One thousand or more substantially similar pieces of campaign literature, including but not limited to mailers, flyers, pamphlets, and door hangers;
- 2. Paid advertisements, including but not limited to advertisements in newspapers, magazines, and on the Internet;
- 3. One thousand or more substantially similar e-mails or pre-recorded telephone calls made within a calendar month.
- C. For purposes of this section, "campaign communication" does not include: small promotional items such as pens, pencils, clothing, mugs, potholders, or other items on which the statement required by this section cannot be reasonably printed or displayed in an easily legible typeface; posters, yard or street signs, billboards, supergraphic signs, skywriting, and similar items; television, cable, satellite, and radio broadcasts or advertisements; communications paid for by a newspaper, radio station, television

station or other recognized news medium; and communications from an organization to its members.

- D. When a new contribution changes the list of contributors required to be disclosed on campaign communications under subsection A, campaign communications must be updated on the following schedule:
- 1. For printed campaign communications under subsection B.1 or subsection B.2, disclosures must be updated within seven calendar days to include current disclosure information every time an order to reproduce the campaign communication is placed, or any time the campaign communication is reprinted;
- 2. For e-mails or pre-recorded telephone calls under subsection B.3, disclosures must be updated to include current disclosure information within seven calendar days.

Amendment #2

The definition of a campaign committee was changed from a \$250 threshold to a \$1,000 threshold in Section 2.12.095. The related change to Section 2.12.270 reflects this update, but uses a cross-reference to Section 2.12.095 in order to keep the language relevant and current even if future amendments are adopted. Also, staff recommends deleting the use of "telegram" as a communication method to help modernize the code.

2.12.270 Campaign statement--Filing requirements.

- A. Each candidate and each committee shall file no fewer than two campaign statements prior to an election, excluding run-off elections, and one campaign statement following the election, excluding run-off elections. Campaign statements shall be filed in accordance with the filing dates prescribed by state law. The semi-annual campaign statement that is filed pursuant to state law following an election shall serve as the post-campaign statement required by this section. If state law does not establish the filing dates for campaign statements, the commission shall set the necessary filing dates.
- B. Each candidate and committee involved in a run-off election, and each committee supporting or opposing a candidate participating in a run-off election, shall file one campaign statement prior to the run-off election in addition to any other campaign statements required by this section and one campaign statement following the run-off election. The semi-annual statement that is filed pursuant to state law following a run-off election shall serve as the post-campaign statement required by this section. The campaign statements shall be filed in accordance with the filing dates prescribed by state law. If state law does not establish the filing dates for campaign statements in run-off elections, the commission shall set the necessary filing dates.
- C. 1. Notwithstanding subsections A and B of this section, a candidate or officeholder who plans to receive contributions or make expenditures of less than the committee threshold in Section 2.12.095 two hundred fifty dollars and who plans to make expenditures of less than two hundred fifty dollars in a calendar year may file a short form campaign statement for that calendar year as prescribed by state laws and regulations. The period covered by the short form is the calendar year. If No other campaign statements must be filed by athe candidate or officeholder who has filed a short form campaign statement for activity in the calendar year unless the candidate makes receives two hundred fifty dollars or more in expenditures or receives contributions that exceed the committee threshold in Section 2.12.095, they must file campaign statements as required by subsections A or B, or other applicable sections of Chapter 2.12.
- 2. During the six months prior to an election in which the candidate or officeholder is being voted upon, a candidate or officeholder who files a short form campaign statement and subsequently receives contributions or makes expenditures exceeding the committee threshold in Section 2.12.095 totaling two hundred fifty dollars or more or makes expenditures totaling two hundred fifty dollars or more during the calendar year

shall send written notification to the City Clerk, and each candidate or officeholder contending for the same office, as follows:

- (a) The notification shall be sent within forty-eight hours of receiving contributions or making expenditures exceeding the committee threshold in Section 2.12.095 totaling two hundred fifty dollars or more or making expenditures of two hundred fifty dollars or more;
- (b) The notification shall include the name and address of the candidate or officeholder, the elective office for which the short form campaign statement was filed, the date of the election, and the date contributions exceeding the committee threshold in Section 2.12.095 totaling two hundred fifty dollars or more were received or expenditures exceeding the committee threshold in Section 2.12.095 totaling two hundred fifty dollars or more were made;
- (c) The notification shall be sent by telegram, guaranteed overnight delivery, personal delivery, or facsimile transmission.

Subject: Public financing matching funds disbursements to Mark

Humbert for Council 2022

On March 30, 2023, Commission staff received the attached complaint alleging that the campaign committee Mark Humbert for Council 2022 ("Committee") included 47 duplicate contributions on two separate matching funds requests (Declarations for Public Funds) and that, as a result, the Committee was awarded duplicate matching funds for these contributions and thereby received public matching funds to which the Committee was not entitled. (Attachment 1.)

Following receipt of the complaint, the Commission Secretary and Clerk Department staff reviewed the Committee's public financing matching funds requests and disbursements of public matching funds. Staff initially concluded that incorrect duplication of qualified contribution entries was likely the result of the filer selecting an incorrect date range within the NetFile system and thereby generating a report which covered some previously reported contributions. Staff determined that, although this may be a reporting irregularity by the Committee, duplicating qualifying contributions in this manner did not violate the Berkeley Election Reform Act ("BERA") (BMC Ch. 2.12). Moreover, given that the Clerk Department reviews all qualifying contributions before disbursing matching funds, staff identified no harm done to the public financing program by the duplicate entries. As a result, staff recommended the Commission dismiss the complaint based on the determination that the complaint did not state a violation of BERA or provide any evidence suggesting that a violation of BERA had occurred. The Commission adopted staff's recommendation at its April 20, 2023 meeting.

Following the Commission's dismissal of the complaint, the complainant further asserted that the Committee's duplicate qualifying contribution entries had resulted in the Committee receiving an overpayment of matching funds. The Commission Secretary and City Clerk indicated that they would review the disbursements further and return at a future Commission meeting with any additional information.

Following additional review of the Committee's filings and disbursements of public matching funds, staff have determined that the Committee received an overpayment of matching funds. As discussed below, City staff have determined that this overpayment was the result of a City clerical error and was not the result of any wrongdoing or violation of BERA by the Committee.

Berkeley Public Financing Program

Under the City's Fair Elections public financing program, participating candidates may receive public matching funds at a 6:1 ratio for all qualified contributions received from a natural person residing in the City of Berkeley. (BMC §§ 2.12.167 & 2.12.505.A.)

In order to receive matching funds, candidates must submit an Initial Qualifying Declaration for Public Funds listing the qualifying contributions the candidate has received, and provide a qualified contribution receipt and supporting documentation (copy of check, online payment etc.) for each contribution. For any subsequent matching funds requests, the candidate must submit a subsequent Declaration for Public Funds, listing the additional qualifying contributions and providing the same receipt and supporting documentation. City Clerk Department staff then review and verify each of the qualifying contribution entries before disbursing matching funds.

The Committee's Matching Funds Requests

The Committee submitted two separate matching funds requests during the 2022 election cycle: one on August 8, 2022 and the other on September 29, 2022. Staff have identified 45 duplicate entries between these two matching requests.

Staff have not identified a provision of BERA that would be violated by submitting duplicate contribution entries. There are a number of reasons a committee may purposely or inadvertently submit one or more duplicate contribution entries. For example, campaigns may resubmit a contribution from a prior matching request where that contribution was initially denied matching funds for having incomplete information. Alternatively, a campaign may inadvertently resubmit one or more contributions by erroneously selecting the wrong date range within the NetFile system from which to generate a contribution report.

The City's NetFile system does not automatically identify duplicate entries. Instead, City staff review candidate matching funds requests to verify each contribution's eligibility for matching funds. BERA provides that it is the duty of the City to verify the eligibility for matching funds of each contribution for which matching funds are disbursed. (See BMC § 2.12.505.D ("The City shall verify that a candidate's qualified contributions meet all of the requirements and restrictions of this Act prior to the disbursement of Fair Elections funds to the candidate.").) Based on staff's review of this matter, City staff unfortunately did not manually check for duplicate entries in accordance with standard procedures in this case.

For its two matching requests, the Committee received a total of \$47,000 in matching funds, which is the limit under the public financing program. (BMC §§ 2.12.505.B.2 & 2.12.545.) The Committee was eligible for an additional \$520 of matching funds, which was withheld due to reaching the \$47,000 limit. The 45 duplicate contribution entries accounted for \$16,140 of these matching funds.

Page 3 Re: Public financing matching funds - Mark Humbert for Council 2022

City staff have identified an additional 41 contributions for which the Committee would have been able to submit matching requests and receive matching funds had the Committee not erroneously reached the \$47,000 matching funds limit due to improper award of matching funds for duplicate entries. The Committee would have been entitled to an additional \$14,520 in matching funds for these 41 eligible contributions. As a result, City staff have determined that the Committee received an overpayment of \$1,100 in matching funds to which it was not entitled under the public financing program. City records indicate that the Committee was terminated on December 26, 2022.

Recommendation


Staff has determined that the overpayment of public matching funds to the Committee was the result of a clerical error by City staff due to failure to adequately perform a manual review of the Committee's matching funds requests. Given that the NetFile system does not automatically identify duplicate qualifying contribution entries, the City's current matching funds disbursement process relies on City staff manually reviewing all contribution entries. Although the Committee submitted duplicate entries in its matching funds requests, staff have not identified a provision of BERA that is violated by submitting one or more duplicate entries. As noted above, the Committee was closed in December 2022 and, as a result, no longer has any funds.

Given that the overpayment was the result of a clerical error by City staff, and staff have been unable to identify a provision of BERA that is violated when a Committee duplicates qualifying contribution entries on a Declaration for Public funds, staff recommends the Commission take no additional enforcement action on this matter. However, the Commission may wish to review this matter as it evaluates and identifies ways to improve the City's public financing system.

On March 30, 2023, Commission staff received the attached complaint alleging that the campaign committee Mark Humbert for Council 2022 ("Committee") included forty-seven duplicate contributions on two separate Declarations for Public Funds and that, as a result, the Committee was awarded duplicate matching funds for these contributions and thereby received public matching funds to which the Committee was not entitled. (Attachment 1.)

In order to receive matching funds under the City's public financing program, candidates must submit an Initial Qualifying Declaration for Public Funds listing the qualifying contributions the candidate has received, and provide a qualified contribution receipt and supporting documentation (copy of check, online payment etc.) for each contribution. For any subsequent matching funds requests, the candidate must submit a subsequent Declaration for Public Funds, listing the additional qualifying contributions and providing the same receipt and supporting documentation.

The complaint alleges that the Committee has reported forty-seven duplicate contributions on two different Declarations for Public Funds. As a result, the complaint states, the Committee may have received matching funds twice for these contributions. This would result in the Committee receiving matching funds in an amount beyond which it was entitled.

The Commission Secretary and City Clerk Department staff have reviewed the Committee's filings and matching funds receipts, including the two Declarations for Public Funds identified in the complaint. Clerk Staff review all qualifying contributions prior to disbursing City funds and have confirmed that the Committee did not receive matching funds for any duplicate entries. Attachments 2 and 3 are copies of the Declarations as reviewed by the Clerk Department prior to disbursement of City funds indicating strikethroughs where Clerk staff identified duplicate entries.

Staff believe that the incorrect duplication of qualified contribution entries in the subsequent Declaration was likely the result of the filer selecting an incorrect date range within the Netfile system and thereby generating a report which covered some previously reported contributions. While this may be a reporting irregularity by the Committee, staff

are unable to identify a provision of the Berkeley Election Reform Act ("BERA") which would be violated by duplicating qualifying contributions in this manner. Additionally, given that the Clerk Department reviews all qualifying contributions before disbursing matching funds, staff have not identified a harm done to the public financing program.


Recommendation

Under the Commission's Procedures the Commission may (1) direct the Secretary to investigate the complaint, to the extent the Secretary has not already done so; (2) dismiss the complaint; or (c) find probable cause to believe BERA has been violated. (FCPC Procedures Section V.B.2.)

Staff recommends the Commission dismiss this complaint. As discussed above, after reviewing the complaint, staff have determined that the complaint does not state a violation of BERA or provide any other evidence suggesting that a violation of BERA has occurred.

Dear Mr. Harvey and Members of the Berkeley FCPC:

Thank you for bringing this complaint to my attention. I agree with Staff's conclusion that it does not state a claim under BERA, and therefore does not have merit as a matter of law.

As you know, the Berkeley City Clerk's Office is punctilious in examining matching requests submitted by Berkeley candidates who are participating in the Berkeley public campaign financing program. Individual forms are often rejected for failure to meet the Clerk's appropriately exacting standards.

My assistant treasurer and I worked diligently to supply the requisite information, but we made mistakes in some instances which were later corrected. The campaign contributions we received from Berkeley residents far exceeded the limit on matchable donations, and once we found we had reached the limit, we did not submit any additional requests for matching.

Some of the reasons for the discrepancies noted by the complainant in the public financing records include:

- Some of our submittals did not have forms correctly attached the first time, and so they were later resubmitted.
- Some of our submittals had errors on the forms that needed to be corrected, and so they were later resubmitted.
- Some of our contributions were accidentally reassigned to the second batch of submissions.
- Some of our contributions occurred earlier in the year, but contributors did not submit their forms until later in the year, and this may have caused us to select a date range that resulted in overlap with previous submittals.

As shown by the City Clerk's documentation, we submitted more unique matching forms than were required. As mentioned above, we had still more donations with forms that we could have submitted had it been necessary. Finally, I am confident that we did not receive from the City any funds in excess of the public financing limit.

We request that this complaint be dismissed.
