CURRENT SITUATION AND ITS EFFECTS

At the March 14, 2023 City Council meeting, the Council passed a resolution to allow two periods of public comment on Action Items and voted to "Refer the suggestions regarding improvements to the meeting process to the Agenda & Rules Committee and the Open Government Commission for consideration." The OGC reviewed the recording of this meeting, comments sent in prior to the meeting, and comments submitted by email or in person at Commission meetings and adopted the following recommendations at its September 21, 2023 meeting.

Action: M/S/C (Blome/O'Donnell) Motion to approve report to City Council with non-substantive edits

BACKGROUND

The City Council asked the Open Government Commission (OGC) to explore improvements to the way City Council meetings offer opportunities for public comment. The OGC agrees with the resolution passed by City Council on March 14, 2023 that added an opportunity for public comment at the start of the Action Calendar and also maintained the opportunity to comment at the time each Action Item is discussed as this allows the public to hear comments, questions, and proposed changes from City

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Councilmembers before making public comment. In addition to this change, the OGC proposes the following:

An item that is not going to pass does not fit the plain English definition of "consent." Such items properly belong in the Action calendar where members of the public may advocate for them and where Councilmembers may discuss their views.

Demonstrates that the Council is receptive to written correspondence and encourages more written comments that can be read ahead of time. ENVIRONMENTAL SUSTAINABILITY AND CLIMATE IMPACTS None.

RATIONALE FOR RECOMMENDATION

The two main problems these recommendations aim to address are 1) that meetings run long, often ending late at night; and 2) long wait times make it difficult for members of the public to comment on issues being discussed, especially when substantive changes are proposed at the last minute.


The OGC plans to continue monitoring the situation to evaluate whether these changes produce the desired outcome of shorter meetings and shorter wait times for the public to speak.

Recent activity of City Council and City Council Agenda and Rules Policy Committee in regards to public access and participation in Council meetings and legislative process - report to Open Government Commission

- Kitt Saginor, February 5, 2024

There are several changes that are under consideration or already in place that relate to the recommendations of the Open Government Commission in September and to open government.

- The set of recommendations that the Open Government Commission voted to forward in September have not been seen by the Council or Agenda and Rules Policy Committee as of this writing February 5th.
- The Berkeley City Council Rules of Procedure and Order have been changed to specifically disallow poles or sticks and to disallow amplified sound (such as a bullhorn) in the Council meeting room.
- For public comment at the beginning of the meeting on matters not on the agenda, the Council has changed practice several times on whether comments will be heard via zoom. The Agenda and Rules Policy Committee discussed this at length and made a decision in November, but that decision has not been implemented nor rescinded.
- At a recent meeting (January 16, 2024) two items on the Council's consent calendar failed because a majority abstained. The item was not first moved to the action calendar. This practice is the subject of OGC's recommendation A.5.
- Council has on several occasions responded to persistent disruption by moving the meeting into a non-public room and continuing it on zoom without members of the public present in person. The Council received notice of possible legal action in opposition to this practice.
- Both the Council and the Agenda and Rules Policy Committee have worked on a City Council Legislative System Redesign. The redesign will change various aspects of how the public accesses and provides input to proposals that are under consideration.
- In October, City Council discussed requiring the City Manager and City Staff to adhere to the same submission deadlines and/or format requirements as councilmembers. That would implement OGC's recommendation A.10: "Require that City Manager and staff publish supporting materials for Agenda items in advance of the Agenda Committee meeting."
- There has been discussion about creating a specified role for commissions in the pre-submission process as part of the Legislative System Redesign.
- As part of the Redesign, the Council has discussed adopting significant calendar changes to align deadlines with the budget process - this would have an impact on opportunities for public comment and other aspects of public interaction with items.
- As part of the Redesign, the Council and the Agenda and Review Committee have discussed allowing city staff to clarify significant implementation questions directly with the item's author(s) after implementation, without referring the item back to Council and public scrutiny.
- The only Council Policy Committees that will hold meetings before May are Agenda and Rules and Budget and Finance. Items already referred to policy committees may be resubmitted by councilmembers and, if urgent, may be placed directly on the Council agenda without the step of being considered at a public meeting of the relevant policy committee.

Subject: Adoption of 2024 FCPC-OGC Joint Concurrent Meeting Schedule

The FCPC and OGC ("Commissions") must set their annual meeting schedule for 2024. Traditionally, the Commissions have met in a concurrent meeting on each third Thursday of the month. Starting last year, the Commissions began meeting at 6:30 p.m. rather than 6 p.m.

At the January 18, 2024 meeting, the Commissions discussed the possibility of moving recurring regular meetings to the first Thursday of each month. In July, the first Thursday falls on Independence Day. The Commissions could call a special meeting or set an alternative date for July.

In recent years, the Commissions have not had a regular meeting scheduled in August or December, consistent with the City Council's recess schedule. This practice is continued in the proposed schedule below. The Commissions may need to schedule additional meetings as needed throughout the year.

SUBJECT: Election of Commission Officers

City commissions must annually elect a Chair and Vice Chair.

The Chair and Vice Chair are elected by the majority of the commission for a one-year term and hold office until their successors are elected or until their terms as members of the commission expire. No commissioner shall serve as chair for more than two consecutive years. There is no term limit for Vice Chair.

The FCPC's Rules of Procedure outline the following responsibilities for the Chair:

- Preside at all Commission meetings
- 2. Appoint committees and chairpersons of committees
- 3. Approve the agenda prior to distribution
- 4. Sign correspondence on behalf of the Commission
- 5. Administer oaths and affirmations to persons testifying before the Commission
- 6. Provide guidance to the Secretary regarding staff execution of Commission business, including, but not limited to, investigations, reviewing campaign statements and audits of candidates and committees
- 7. Represent the Commission in dealings with the City Manager, the City Attorney, and other City staff
- 8. Represent the Commission before the City Council
- 9. Exercise the authority of the Commission with regard to administrative matters

The role of the Vice-Chair is to assume the above roles in the absence of the Chair.



INITIAL QUALIFYING REQUEST FOR FAIR ELECTIONS FUNDS PAYMENT

In order to participate in the Public Financing Program, a candidate must collect at least 30 Qualified Contributions from at least 30 unique contributors of at least \$10.00 and no more than \$60.00 each, for a total dollar amount of at least \$580.00.

All approved Qualified Contributions are matched at a 6:1 ratio. For all public matching funds requests, a candidate must submit the following documentation:

- Qualified Contributions List (below).
- Receipt for Qualified Contribution for Fair Elections Funds.
- Evidence of each contribution received, such as electronic copies of contributor checks, credit card authorizations, or online payment receipts.
- Electronic copies of itemized deposit slips.
- Complete contributor information (full name, address, occupation, and employer) as required by BERA and the Political Reform Act.
