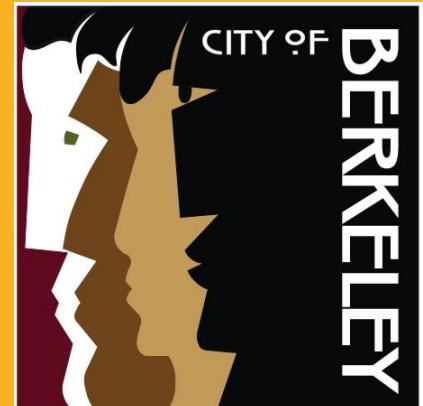

The present city charter, first adopted in 1909, initially authorized a personnel board, a **Civic Arts Commission**, and a Welfare Commission, and a Board of library trustees



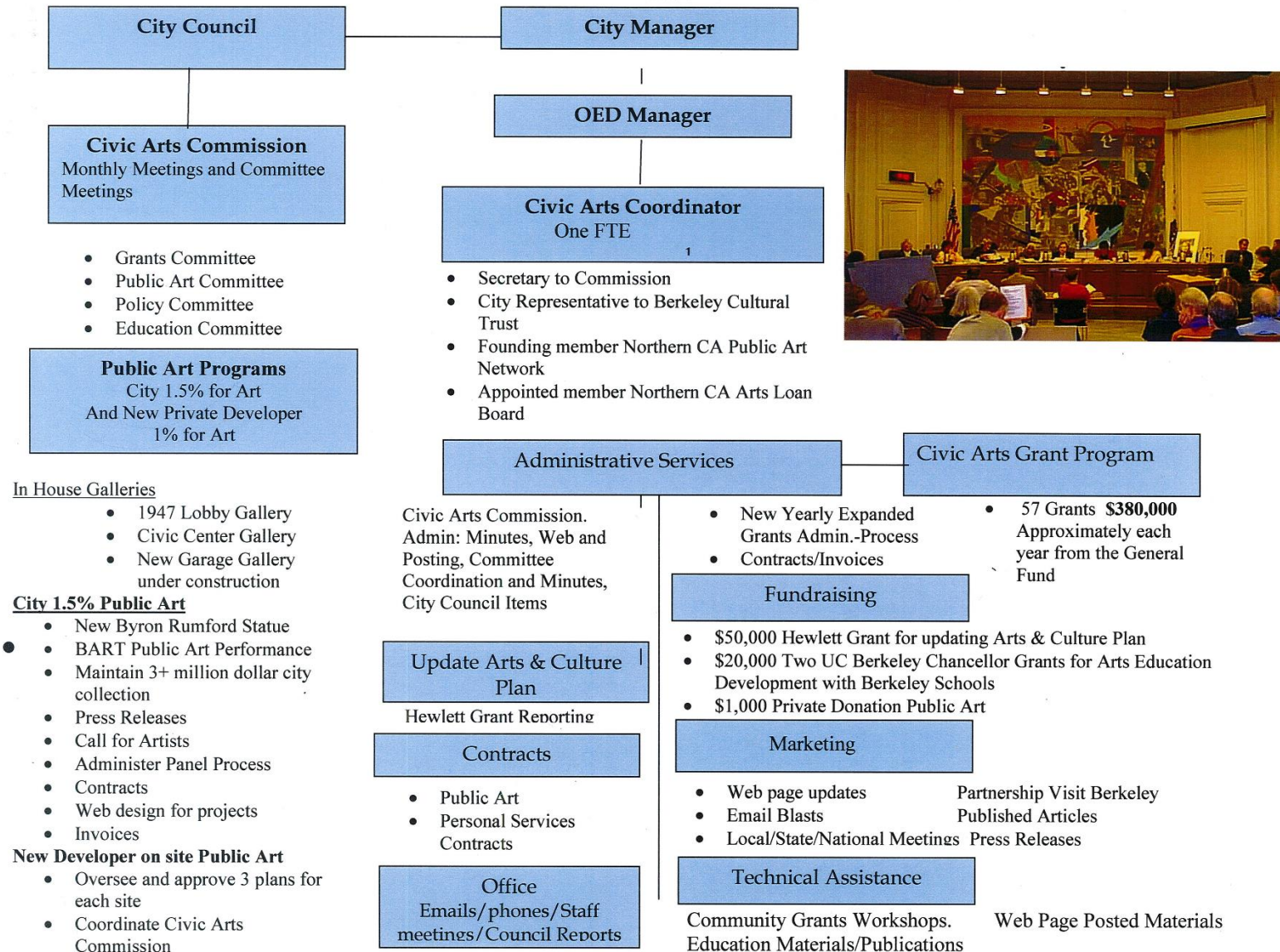
CIVIC ARTS COMMISSION: ROLE AND FUNCTION

- Encourage programs for the cultural enrichment of the City and help make City resources available to cultural groups.
- Advise the City Council on all matters affecting the beauty and culture of the City.
- Provide support for art groups in their search for funding from county, state, federal and private sources and pursue projects which would provide funding for the arts.
- Coordinate and strengthen existing organizations in the arts and develop cooperation with regional organizations.
- Advise the City Council on all matters pertaining to the quality, quantity, scope, and style of art in public places.

PUBLIC ART PROGRAM

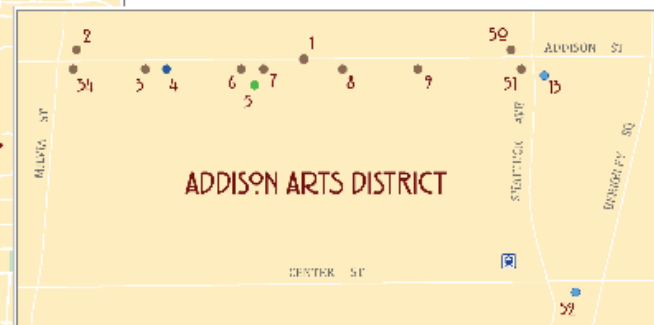
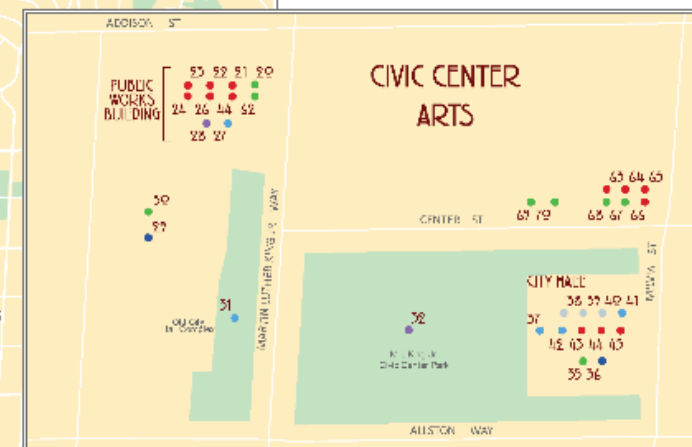
City of Berkeley Public Art

Commission's authority:

- Can choose the Artist
- Can choose the site
- Do not need to go to City Council for approval
- Can commission a work of art without a Call for Artists
- Can set up an open Call for Artists with city staff

Private Percent for Art

- Private developer chooses Consultant and art
- The Commission approves the Consultant list
- The Commission with staff oversees process
- Commission can make suggestions in art and placement, but private developer has the final say.

THE BROWN ACT AND PUBLIC GOVERNMENT

ENSURES OPEN AND FAIR MEETINGS AND PUBLIC ACCESS TO DOCUMENTS

- Full Commission agendas must be posted at least three working days before the meeting.
- Subcommittee agendas must be posted one working day before the meeting.
- Cannot address the whole Commission on any email
- Any documents or discussions that take place during the Civic Arts Commission meetings become public documents

RELATIONSHIP WITH STAFF

- The Secretary, and all staff report to the City Manager.
- The Secretary assist the Commission, but the Commission cannot dictate the secretary or other city staff's work plan.
- Need to contact the secretary and not other city staff; all business should go through the secretary. If she is not available, contact other Civic Arts Staff and/or the manager of Office of Economic Development.
