On Thursday, June 14, from 6:00 - 7:30pm at the South Berkeley Senior Center, the Office of Energy & Sustainable Development (OESD), in conjunction with the Ecology Center and Berkeley Climate Action Coalition, will host a community workshop about East Bay Community Energy (EBCE). EBCE is Alameda County's electricity provider, and will begin serving commercial customers in June, and residential customers in November.

This workshop is one part of a suite of ongoing OESD efforts to educate Berkeley businesses and residents about their electricity options through EBCE. Increasing participation in EBCE is a key strategy of Berkeley's <u>Climate Action Plan</u>.


