The building at 2000 Shattuck Ave. was originally constructed in 1927, designed by architect Henry A. Minton for Bank of Italy, which became Bank of America. The bank's location on this site predated the construction of the Bank of America building at Shattuck Avenue and Center Street in the 1960s. It was subsequently remodeled for San Francisco Federal Savings, which removed the façade and created a new perimeter designed by Masten, Hurd, & Gwathney Architects.

The current remodeled building has lost its physical association with its past. Although the massing and placement on the site remain the same, the 1927 façade no longer exists and the changes do not seem reversible. The property therefore is not a Contributor to the Shattuck Avenue Downtown Historic District.

The firm of Masten, Hurd, and Gwathmey was formed in 1959 in San Francisco, and succeeded an earlier firm consisting of architects Baldini, Hurd, Masten, Raney, and Stout. The firm is noted for designing the School of Public Health, Cancer Research and Genetics Laboratory on the University of California Berkeley campus, as well as the Bevatron nuclear particle accelerator.
