

Saturday, March 10th

Equity in the Adeline Corridor Plan, 10:30am - 12:00pm

Equity has emerged as an important overarching theme expressed by community members during the planning process to-date. Join a discussion of what equity means as a community and provide equity-focused feedback on the planning effort as a whole, as well as on the five priority focus areas that have been identified by the community: housing affordability, economic opportunity, transportation, public space and land use/community character.

Economic Opportunity in the Adeline Corridor, 9:00am - 10:30am

Come join City of Berkeley Office of Economic Development staff along with your business-owner, property-owner and other local community organization colleagues, to hear about the current business environment in South Berkeley and share OED's plan for business services in 2018 and 2019. In addition, staff will discuss how the Adeline Corridor Plan can promote additional economic opportunities in South Berkeley.

Saturday, March 17th

Affordable Housing and Community Benefits, 10:00am - 11:30am

A growing number of communities have been developing community benefits frameworks as part of community planning processes. These frameworks require or encourage new development projects to address the community's high priority needs, such as affordable housing and anti-displacement. Learn about and discuss strategies such as community benefits requirements, to achieve community goals.

Redesigning the Right-of-Way to Improve Mobility, Safety, and Public Spaces, 12:00pm - 1:30pm

Based on community feedback collected to-date and further technical analysis, the planning team has refined design concepts for the Adeline/South Shattuck street right-of-way for further community discussion. The workshop will open with an introduction of these concepts, followed by questions and a discussion.
