

(2) Rejection of current “remedies” planned by the City for addressing the 2111 Harold Way Project’s impact on BHS as vague, clearly incomplete, and virtually unenforceable.

I respectfully request the ZAB reject as inadequate the current “remedies” planned by the City for addressing the Harold Way Project’s impact on BHS as vague, clearly incomplete, and virtually unenforceable.

(3) Direct City to clearly and specifically address BHS Safety Committee and School District lists of concerns. I respectfully request that the ZAB direct the City to go back to the BHS Safety Committee and School District lists of concerns and specifically and clearly address each one.

(4) Direct City to City to include the BHS Safety Committee/School Site Council in its discussions on mitigating the Project’s impact on school facilities and the school community. I respectfully request the ZAB to direct the City to include the BHS Safety Committee and School Site Council members in addition to the BHS Facility manager in its discussions about how to mitigate the Project’s impact on school facilities and the school community. The School District had specifically requested that Project mitigations be addressed with “documented input from the school community, including the BUSD Executive Director of Facilities, the BHS Facility and Operations Manager, *and the BHS Safety Committee.*”

The purpose of these requests and shoring up the necessary Project mitigations now is to ensure that the Project does not have severe and adverse impacts on the health, safety, and welfare of the BHS community, and to ensure that more delays will not be necessary later because the City has failed to address critical issues with respect to the School.
