SUBJECT: TACTICAL SCIENCE OF LAW ENFORCEMENT COURSE

Bay Area Urban Area Security Initiative is presenting a forty-hour Tactical Science of Law Enforcement Course, December 5-9, 2016, at the Flamingo Hotel, 2777 Fourth Street, Santa Rosa.

This course is not about tactics, but rather the fundamental doctrinal principles from which tactics are derived. It is designed for first responders, supervisors and support personnel who are charged with sorting order from chaos when encountering disasters, accidents, barricaded suspects, active shooters and other types of situations. Practical application scenarios are specifically designed to highlight shortcomings, deficiencies and inadequacies frequently experienced in tactical operations and disaster responses.

SUBJECT: TACTICAL LIFESAVER COURSE

Bay Area UASI Regional Training and Exercise Program is presenting an eight-hour Tactical Lifesaver Course, Friday, June 24, 2016, from 0800 to 1700 hours, at the City of Santa Rosa, Utilities Field Operations, Room M, 35 Stony Point Road, Santa Rosa.

The course is specifically designed to provide law enforcement officers with the knowledge and abilities which might enable them to be able to treat life threatening injuries, wounds, conditions presented to them in the course of their duties. The enhance skill set developed increases chances of survival in the event of serious injury to the officer, fellow officers and/or civilians – officers can treat and self-treat injuries in the critical moments prior to the arrival of emergency medical personnel.

Item regarding Temporary Moratorium on the Mistreatment of Homeless Residents of Berkeley

To: Police Review Commissioners

Recommendation: I propose that the PRC recommends this language to the city council:

1. Calling on the City Council of Berkeley to review and create a new protocol that deals with the removal, storage and retrieval of personal property. This protocol should have guidelines that work towards creating a safe and healthy removal process. The police department needs to coordinate with Public Works, Health, Housing, and Community Services, Parks and Rec.
2. The council should research and work towards creating navigation centers and sanctuary locations where individuals can reside/form encampments. These sanction locations should be form on certain guidelines and will help avoid police being called upon for removal of property. Cities such as Oakland, Santa Rosa, Portland, and Seattle have implemented similar sanctuary policies.
3. In the interest of facilitation, simple and clear communications between the encampment participants and the police department, we should ensure that the enforcement actions occur during a reasonable hour; should be done during daylight hours.
