



HEARST COMPLETE STREETS

Improving Safety and Access on Hearst Avenue

Open House on March 11

Come learn about, and provide input on, the Hearst Avenue Complete Streets Project, a \$3 million, federally funded project to improve safety and access for pedestrians, bicyclists, bus riders and motorists. Improvements are proposed on Hearst between Shattuck and La Loma/Gayley. Key features include:

- Replace approximately 35 parking spaces with sidewalk and bike lane between Tolman Hall and North Gate (pedestrians/cyclists on this section of Hearst currently travel between parked cars and high-speed traffic)
- Vehicle turn restrictions at Hearst/Spruce and Hearst/Arch, to reduce through traffic on Spruce and Arch
- New traffic signal at Hearst/Le Roy
- New bike lanes, pedestrian crossings, curb ramps for wheelchair users, and other features
