



Disabled Person Placard/Plates Parking Guidelines

A vehicle displaying a valid Disabled Person placard or license plate may park:

- In parking spaces with the International Symbol of Access (wheelchair symbol)
- Next to a blue curb authorized for persons with disabilities parking
- Next to a green curb without restrictions to time limits
- In an on-street metered parking space at no charge
- On a street that indicates it requires a residential or preferential parking permit

You may NOT park:

- In spaces marked with a crosshatched pattern next to a parking space with the International Symbol of Access (wheelchair symbol), as these spaces are for wheelchair and wheelchair lift access
- Next to red curbs, which indicate no stopping, standing, or parking
- Next to yellow curbs, which are for commercial loading/unloading zones
- Next to white curbs, which are for passenger loading/unloading or depositing mail in an adjacent mailbox
- Where signs indicate no parking during a specified duration, such as street sweeping or for traffic management
- In areas designated "Tow Away" by posted signage
- In spaces designated "Reserved" by posted signage
