1. Roll call – Acting-Chair Laverde called the meeting to order at 7:05 p.m.

- 3. <u>Public Forum</u> Christine Schwartz expressed frustration that her building elevator has been out of service for over a month and discussed the impact of that and ongoing construction on her life. "W.B.C." conveyed his opinion that he has been discriminated against by the Rent Board and the abuse he has suffered at the hands of another tenant. A third speaker ceded her time to "W.B.C."
